Dear Parish Family,

On Thursday, October 24, 2024, Pope Francis issued the Encyclical Letter 'Dilexit Nos' from the Latin meaning, "He loved us". The subtitle being 'On the human and divine love of the heart of Jesus'. This is Pope Francis' fourth Encyclical Letter to the Church; encyclicals are the highest teaching of a Pope. In June, he had announced his intention of writing an Encyclical on the Sacred Heart and he said, "I believe it will do us great good to meditate on various aspects of the Lord's love, which can illuminate the path of ecclesial renewal and say something meaningful to a world that seems to have lost its heart."

The Italian Theologian and Bishop Bruno Forte, who was entrusted with presenting the encyclical, described it as "the key to his entire pontificate" and "the inspiring motive of [his] whole ministry and magisterium." He went further to say, "The encyclical calls us to be missionaries...who transmit love, who love therefore with witness, with presence alone, with words when needed, without the need to engage in proselytism."

Quoting Pope Benedict XVI, the encyclical says, "Every person needs a 'center' for his or her own life, a source of truth and goodness to draw upon in the events, situations, and struggles of daily existence. All of us, when we pause in silence, need to feel not only the beating of our own heart, but deeper still, the beating of a trustworthy presence, perceptible with faith's senses and yet much more real: the presence of Christ, the heart of the world" (Angelus, June 1, 2008).

The Holy Father Francis says we can find consolation in our sufferings within the heart of Jesus, "Our sufferings are joined to the suffering of Christ on the cross. If we believe that grace can bridge every distance, this means that Christ by his sufferings united himself to the sufferings of his disciples in every time and place. In this way, whenever we endure suffering, we can also experience the interior consolation of knowing that Christ suffers with us." The pope adds: "As we contemplate the heart of Christ, the incarnate synthesis of the Gospel, we can, following the example of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus, 'place heartfelt trust not in ourselves but in the infinite mercy of a God who loves us unconditionally and has already given us everything in the cross of Jesus Christ."

The encyclical speaks of the missionary impulse every Christian should possess, "Jesus is calling you and sending you forth to spread goodness in our world...His call is one of service, a summons to do good, perhaps as a physician, a mother, a teacher, or a priest. Wherever you may be, you can hear his call and realize that he is sending you forth to carry out that mission."

He quotes Popes Leo XIII, Pius XII, John Paul II, Benedict XVI, St. Charles de Foucauld, St. Therese of the Child Jesus, St. Francis de Sales and of course St. Mary Margaret Alacoque. He also quotes the German Philosopher Martin Heidegger and the Russian Writer Fyodor Dostoevsky.

The encyclical is a mixture of devotion and action. Devotion to the Sacred Heart began as early as the 8th Century as a result of the writings of the early Church Fathers' teachings, that the Holy Spirit flowed out upon the Church from Jesus pierced side, this wound that gives us access to His Heart. Devotion did not take hold until the 12Th century, when St. Bonaventure addressed it in his theological writings, and later the mystical writings of the Medieval Mystics St. Mechtilde of Magdeburg, St. Julian Norwich, and St. Catherine of Siena popularized it. The seventeenth century saw an increase in devotion due the instructions of St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556), St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622), and St. John Eudes (1601-1680) who wrote a Mass dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

Modern devotion can be traced to the visions of the French Visitation nun Sr. Mary Margaret Alacoque who, three years after entering Religious Life, had visions of the Sacred Heart from Dec. 1674-June 1675. The Visitation Order was founded by St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622), and he directed them to devotion to the Sacred Heart. In her visions St. Mary Margaret was asked to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart on the First Friday of every month. Specifically, to go to confession, attend Mass, and receive Holy Communion on 9 successive Fridays; additionally, on the Thursday eve of First Friday, to keep a holy hour in memory of Jesus in Gethsemane. St. Mary Margaret said Jesus made 12 specific promises as a reward for keeping this honor:

- (1) "I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- (2) I will establish peace in their homes.
- (3) I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- (4) I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- (5) I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- (6) Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- (7) Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- 10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- (11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- (12) I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
