Dear Parish Family-

One of the Wisdom Books of the Old Testament is the Book of Ecclesiastes where it says, "There is an appointed time for everything and a time for every affair under the heavens". In 1959, Pete Seeger took passages from chapter 3 verses 1-8 and created the pop hit "Turn, Turn, Turn", that went to the top of the charts in 1965 after it was sung by the Byrds, "to everything turn, turn, turn. There is a season turn, turn, turn. And a time to every purpose under heaven." Both Ecclesiastes and Seeger were reminding us that everything has its season and purpose and nothing is forever, except God!

With a tinge of sadness, I share with you that our long time weekend assistant, Msgr. Joe Ciampaglio, will be leaving us. His last day of service in the parish will be Sunday, November 26th at the 10:30am Mass; there will be reception in Morello Hall following the Mass sponsored by the Knights of Columbus.

Msgr. Joe has made the difficult, but necessary, decision to sell his home in Lakewood and enter into a Spring Point Transitional Living arrangement. He has purchased an apartment where he will be able to live independently but should he need it, can transition to assisted living, skilled nursing and memory care all in the same facility. Msgr. Joe has no family here; he is close to many nieces and nephews who all live in northern, New Jersey. This year Msgr. Joe experienced some health issues, none life threatening, that gave him and his family pause. In the New Year, on January 17, 2024, Msgr. Joe will turn 88 years.

The facility he has chosen is near his family, in fact his nephew works in the same town and can be at the facility in minutes if need be. There are several other priests he knows already living there and some 12+ Religious Sisters also living there whom he knows well. So, this is a good transition for him and a good time to make the decision outside of an emergency situation. I know Msgr. Joe has mixed feelings about the move, but he knows it is the right thing at the right time. Please join us at the 10:30am Mass on Sunday, November 26th to bid him a fond farewell and best wishes in his time of transition!

Like many retired priests, being a weekend assistant was his longest assignment! He has been helping out at St. Aloysius for over 20 years! What a great run and what a blessing he has been to our entire community!

Dear Parish Family-

The past week has been a bee hive of activity here. The roof work progresses; the roofers began installation of the snow guards on the eastern side of the Church and are working their way around the building. The old roof did not have snow guards which break up snow and ice as it slides down the roof, so ice and snow would careen down the slaloms and do a lot of damage on the way. There remain approximately 8 standing seam panel sections which have to be removed and a lot of little detail work. Work will continue through the month of December as originally expected.

The Church is closed during the day, please do not attempt to enter the Church during the weekdays, this is extremely dangerous to you and the workers.

The chapel in Gonzaga Hall is open all day for private prayer; the Blessed Sacrament is there, statues, candles, Book of Remembrance and so forth. Access is through the parish office for security reasons. There is no need to attempt access to the Church. Your cooperation is appreciated during this temporary situation.

Work began last Monday on the new doors for the Church and is progressing smoothly. This weekend, you will see the interior doors have been replaced. With new doors it is essential you do *not* over extend them. They are not all crammed together like the last set. Please do not push them all the way open against the frame, this damages the doors, hinges, closures etc.

Please DO NOT prop them open. This has become a regular habit among ushers and some parishioners. It is a violation of the fire code and creates a very dangerous situation in an emergency. Few people die from fire burns today, most people die from smoke inhalation. Smoke is stoked when doors are left open feeding oxygen to the fire and producing large quantities of smoke that kill. All the exit doors *must* remain closed. This means you will need to open and close them just like you do at home and in your vehicle, no difference. Thank you.

This week Baut Studios will be replacing the exterior doors. Like with the roof, please do not attempt to enter the Church, which is closed during the week. Please allow the workers to do their job in a timely and concentrated fashion. Your presence is distracting and can cause injury to you or the worker. For safety reasons please avail yourself of the chapel in Gonzaga Hall that is open all day with access through the parish office.

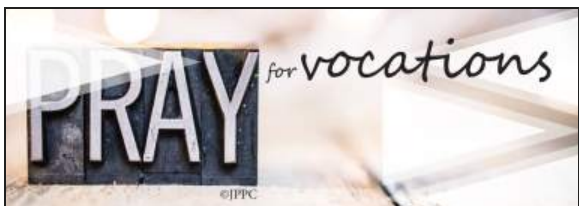
