Dear Parish Family-

The Diocese of Trenton has informed us that the months of November and December will be used as the planning phases of the Ordinary Synod of Bishops to put in place a framework by the Diocesan Synod Committee headed by Deacon Patrick Brannigan and Mary Liz Ivans with support from Mrs. Terry Ginther our Diocesan Chancellor and Executive Director of Pastoral Life.

I have written extensively about the Synod to keep you informed and I know some folks are getting a little uneasy wondering what is going on and why the process is moving so slowly. In reality the process came upon us quite fast which left little time for planning which must be done during this phase of the Synod. Originally the Diocesan Phase was to last from November to April, a rather short time frame. The World's Dioceses communicated with the Holy See this was a limited time frame for what Pope Francis considers the most important phase! Since the Synod is structured primarily around 'listening' the Holy See 'heard' these observations clearly and announced the Diocesan Phase will be extended by 3 months, "Aware that a synodal church is a church that listens, considering that this first phase is essential for this synodal path and evaluating these requests, and always seeking the good of the church, the Ordinary Council of the Synod of Bishops has decided to extend until Aug. 15, 2022, the deadline for the presentation of the summaries of the consultations"

That is good news indeed. The Diocese of Trenton announced this week the participation process will roll out in January & February of 2022.

Many ask the question of what motivates Pope Francis and how to understand his thinking. I have in the past noted, like many commentators, he is a man focused on Mercy and steeped in Ignatian Spirituality. That is the Spiritual teachings of Ignatius of Loyola the founder of the Company of Jesus or 'Jesuits' as we call them today. Every decision the Pope makes is done within the prism of St. Ignatius teachings on discernment.

However there are other principles Pope Francis uses and which he repeats in every major document he writes and can be found in part in nearly all his speeches, homilies, and other minor documents. There are principally four of them:

- Time is greater than Space.
- Unity prevails over conflict
- Reality is more important than ideas
- The Whole is greater than the part

Of the four, the one he gives a priori attention to is the first, "Time is greater than space". A very strange and odd expression, by which he means that Time is out of our control, it is a bit ephemeral, and passes through our attempt to grasp it. It cannot be controlled by us nor can we have power over it. Space on the other hand is something we can control, dominate, and possess. When we give attention to Space we are on the wrong path, because time is greater. Time allows things to work out without domination or force. I have borrowed from another commentator this definition for 'Time is greater than Space':

"This principle enables us to work slowly but surely, without being obsessed with immediate results. It helps us patiently to endure difficult and adverse situations, or inevitable changes in our plans. Giving priority to space means madly attempting to keep everything together in the present, trying to possess all the spaces of power and of self-assertion; it is to crystallize processes and presume to hold them back. Giving priority to time means being concerned about initiating processes rather than possessing spaces." (EG223) Basically, we should not try to solve problems at once, but take the time to have many discussions and develop mutual understanding for peace. This is because when we look at problems spatially, we tend to rely on force when we want to solve problems quickly."

The last sentence hints at the second principle of Pope Francis, "Unity prevails over conflict" and which leads to the third principle "reality is more important than ideas" which flows into the fourth principle "The whole is greater than the part".

Concerning the first principle "time is greater than space", this was also a central thought of the great 20th Century Rabbi, Philosopher, Theologian (in the areas of Prophets and Mysticism), Ethicist, Poet and Civil Rights Activist Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel. I recently had the opportunity to watch a documentary on Jewish/Black relations during the Civil Rights Era in which Heschel was featured and just finished reading collection of Heschel's writings. Heschel also emphasizes this idea that Time is Greater than Space. He views it as Biblical and Spiritual. Heschel was descended from the founder of the Haisidic Movement within Orthodox Judaism, Rabbi Yisra'el ben Eli'ezer called the "Ba'al Shem Tov". Heschel was destined to become a great Rebbe, a title he never inherited. Born in Poland he eventually became the successor to Martin Buber in Berlin, he narrowly escaped the Nazi's and his entire family perished in the Holocaust. He came to the USA first to Ohio and then New York where he taught at Jewish Theological Seminary until his death in 1972. Rabbi Heschel was instrumental at Vatican II where he was a major contributor to the Council Document *Nostra Aetate*, on the Churches relations with non-Christian religions, most notably the Jews.

Rabbi Heschel teaching on time is greater than space, "It is within time rather than within space that we are able to commune, worship, to love. It is within time that one day may be worth a thousand years" He also taught, "It is impossible for man to shirk the problem of time. The more we think the more we realize: we cannot conquer time through space. We can only master time in time. The higher goal of spiritual living is not to amass a wealth of information, but to face sacred moments. What is retained in the soul is the moment (time) of insight rather than the place (space) where the act came to pass. A moment of insight is a fortune..Spiritual life begins to decay when we fail to sense the grandeur of what is eternal in time. We must not forget that it is not a thing that lends significance to a moment; it is the moment that lends significance to things."

He taught that Judaism was a "Religion of Time" and by extension we can say Christianity is also a Religion of Time. He said the gods of other religions were associated with places and things but the God of Israel was a God of History and Time. Our God manifests Himself in Time and not in places or things (space).

He taught that "authentic faith is more than an echo of a tradition. It is a creative situation, an event" in time. In the Synodal process the Holy Father Francis wants us to realize Time is greater than space. That we cannot simply lean on the echo of tradition as if it were something stuck in the space of another generation but rather that it is alive in time, the time we live in and we must respond not by being stuck in space but moving in a creative way in time precisely because God is active in time and not space.

Speaking of the whole is greater than the part, Heschel says, "The danger begins when, completely caught in one perspective, we attempt to consider a part as the whole." Pope Francis would very much agree!

Another aphorism of Rabbi Heschel which arises out of his study of the Hebrew Prophets is, "Some are guilty, all are responsible" The success of the Synod is everyone's responsibility so please, when the opportunity is announced, take responsibility to be part of the Synod process and invite your relatives, friends, co-workers, associates etc to take part as well. Pope Francis is sincerely inviting EVERYONE to take part and wants to LISTEN to what you have to say, God calls all of us to participation in time and not to be stuck in space.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us,
make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.
Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray
from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the
Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.
