Dear Parish Family-

From time to time someone will ask me a question about Purgatory and Gregorian Masses. This usually occurs around November due to All Saints and All Souls day. Purgatory, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us (1030-1031) "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation: but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name **Purgatory** to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." Purgatory is part of the deposit of Faith.

Gregorian Masses are a pious custom which began in the Benedictine Monastery of St. Andrew (now called St. Gregory the Great) in Rome. The monastery of St. Andrew was established in 570AD in what had been the home of the man who would become Pope Gregory I. Gregory was the Abbott of the Monastery when in the year 590AD he was elected Pope. Shortly after the election, one of the monks named Justus violated the Rule of St. Benedict and word was transmitted to the former Abbot now Pope Gregory 1 who ordered a series of penances Justus had to fulfill. After completing the penances, Justus died. Pope Gregory was concerned about the state of his former monk's soul, he said, 'We must come by charity to his aid". Pope Gregory I instructed the new Abbot to have one of the priest monks offer 30 Masses in the Monastic Church, uninterrupted Masses, for 30 consecutive days for Justus soul. At the end of the 30 days a monk named Copiosus while sleeping had a vision of Justus who told him his soul was freed from purgatory due to the charity of the Masses said in his regard. Pope St. Gregory I, the Great, recounts the events in his work called the "The Book of Dialogues". Originally the practice was limited to St. Andrew's Monastery but eventually the practice spread to the whole Church. Today the custom is greatly reduced due to the shortage of priests however still available in monasteries, Seminaries, Houses of Study and in places where priests do not have parish work. One of our daily communicants was kind enough to send me information on a religious order that still takes these requests; Pious Union of St. Joseph 935 East Michigan Ave. Grass Lake, MI 49240-9210, Phone 571-522-8017. Fax 517-522-8387, Website is: www.pusj.org These Masses can only be offered for the dead.

Due to Covid-19 we are unable to have a Book of Remembrance that people can sign due to contact issues however we have placed a Grey Binder in front of the Statute of Our Lady of Fatima with the names of those who died in the last year. This also serves as a Symbolic Book of Remembrance for the whole parish and an oil candle is lit every time Mass is offered to remember our dearly departed.

You are not obligated to attend Mass at this time due to Pandemic. **Bishop O'Connell encourages Catholics to attend an in-person Mass** or participate in Mass via Live Stream until the dispensation ceases in order to "Keep Holy, the Lord's Day". Please note each week 2 Masses are archived for viewing later in the day.
- ➤ Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. ***Those in high risk categories and those with preexisting conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream.***

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ Mask must cover both the nose and the mouth
- √ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before you arrive.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed <u>after</u> Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ Communion can be taken on the tongue or the hand, the risk is identical.

The State permits us to have 1/3 of capacity which is 377 people, for safety we are using 25% or 286 people per Mass. The highest # of people at Mass has been at 10:30am and we have only reached 13% of capacity. To assist you in assessing the risk the following numbers from last weekend may be of help to you. - Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and other Celebrations limited to 50 people this number includes family, clergy, outside attendants, anyone breathing and all the restrictions found above for weekend Masses.


Adopt A Family
