Dear Parish Family,

Most Catholics can tell you about the Jewish New Year, but how many know that Catholics also have a New Year? No, not January 1; that is the civic New Year. Our New Year, like the Jewish one, moves to a different date each year based on the lunar calendar. The use of the lunar calendar is rooted in our connection to nature and the natural world. In the Book of Genesis, God gives humans the care of creation. Pope Francis used his Encyclical "Laudato Si" to draw our attention to the care of our common home. Pope Leo XIV has further drawn our attention by including a "Mass of Creation" in the Roman Missal. We are caretakers of creation; it is our common duty to care for our common home and all its inhabitants. The Church's prayer or liturgical cycle is deeply intertwined with creation itself.

Next Sunday, November 23rd, is the Solemnity of Christ the King, who reigns over all. It marks the end of the Liturgical year; in a sense, the prayer cycle of the Church is crowned with the Solemnity of Christ the King.

The following weekend, November 30-December 1, we begin a new liturgical cycle of prayer, marking the start of the Catholic New Year. It always begins with our faith, even before the birth of Jesus. As a Church, Advent, although brief, lasting barely 4 weeks in some years and barely 3 weeks in others, draws us back to the time of Mary's Conception, Annunciation, and Visitation. It celebrates Saints of light connected to Christmas, such as St. Juan Diego, St. Lucy, and St. Nicholas of Myra, as well as the Marian feasts of Our Lady of Loreto and Our Lady of Guadalupe. Through the Old Testament Readings during Advent, we hear the prophecies that foretell the Messiah, and then we come to the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord.

Advent is a preparatory time and therefore a semi-penitential season, a 'little Lent' reflected in the use of violet for the liturgical color, calling us to repentance in preparation for the birth of Jesus, to heed the words of St. John the Baptist, "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight your path."

The liturgical life of prayer is not linear with a point of start and a point of ending. It is a cycle, a continuous, unending circle of worship, reflecting the nature of the natural world and its Creator, God, who is without beginning or end.

The Solemnity of Christ the King harkens us to give thanks for all that has come to pass and to look with hope upon the dawn of a new year of prayer and thanksgiving to God. Giving thanks to God for all we have and for all we have lost, knowing that all times and seasons, including our own, belong to him and nothing is lost that resides in His presence.

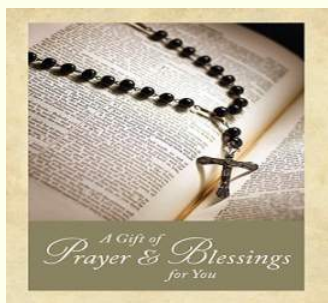

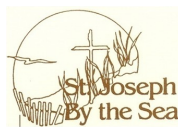

Sacrament of MATRIMONY - We welcome and congratulate all who are seeking the Sacrament of Matrimony. Church arrangements and marriage preparation should be made one year in advance for those who are registered with the parish and living in Jackson. Call the parish office as soon as possible at 732-370-0500 ext. 204. If you are making plans for a "destination wedding," please call the parish office first. There is a way to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony before your destination wedding.

MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION - The Convalidation of a Marriage is a special wedding ceremony by which one's marriage is recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church. Through this process your marriage will be fully embraced by the Church, granting it all the spiritual blessings and benefits it offers. If you are interested in learning more about a Marriage Convalidation contact the parish office.

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To begin the process of scheduling a date for Baptism, families are asked to be registered in the parish. Parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism Prep Class, and Godparents will need to provide a Letter of Eligibility from their current parish (where they reside). Baptisms are held most Sundays at 12:00pm, following the 10:30am Mass. For more information or to schedule a date, please call the parish office. No Baptism date can be secured until all requirements are met.



Why register with a parish?

Registering with a parish allows for a more personal connection with the church community, helps the parish plan for its needs, and is often necessary for receiving sacraments, acting as a godparent, or receiving a donation statement. It provides a sense of belonging and commitment to the faith community and enables the parish to better minister to you, especially during important life events or times of need.

If you've been attending Mass, and a Jackson resident, but have not formally registered with us, contact the parish office to receive a Parish Registration Form or pick one up from an Usher at Sunday Mass. Please keep in mind, only registered parishioners are eligible for sponsor letters.
