We should all be grateful the Lord gives us this small task to share his love and be his hands!

For those dropping off dinners, you can do so on Saturday, November 23rd from 8:30am-11:30am only. Please do not attempt to leave dinners with the parish office, we do not have adequate freezer/refrigerator space, in fact, we have no freezers at all! The Turkey Drive happens regardless of the weather conditions rain/shine/snow etc.

One 12-16lb Turkey One 24 or32 oz Box of instant mashed potatoes or two 13oz boxes of the same One 12 oz box of stove top stuffing mix or two 6oz boxes Two 20oz **cans** of yams (**Cans ONLY**, no glass) One 16oz **canned** cranberry sauce (**Cans ONLY**, no glass) Two 12oz **cans** of Turkey Gravy (**Cans ONLY**, no glass) Three 16oz **cans** (1 each) carrot, corn, peas (**Cans ONLY**) One 29oz **can** of Peaches (**Cans ONLY**, no Glass) One box yellow or white cake mix One can chocolate frosting Two Boxes Corn Muffin Mix

Now, not everyone can pack all this up and get it here, we understand that, you can still take part by providing a \$50.00 (or more) gift card to local grocery stores, gas stations or fast food establishments. The gift cards will be used to minister to the needs of those down on their luck, and to supplement larger family dinners; remember people are not just hungry at Thanksgiving, the need is year round!

Thanks again for your generosity, whether it be it physical, spiritual or material. All of us working together can build a better, gentler world in our community so that no one goes without. In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.



The Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, celebrated annually on November 21st, commemorates the presentation of the Blessed Virgin as a

child by her parents in the Temple in Jerusalem. Before Mary's birth, her parents received a heavenly message that they would bear a child. In thanksgiving for the God's gift of Mary's birth, they brought her to the Temple to consecrate their only daughter to The Lord. The celebration of the Feast is first documented in the 11th century within the Byzantine Catholic Church. It was introduced into the Roman Catholic Church in the 15th century by Pope Gregory XI, then removed from the calendar by Pope Pius V in the mid 16th century. Pope Sixtus V later reestablished the feast in 1585, and it is still celebrated today, commemorating the faith of her parents, loachim and Anne, and the purity of Mary.
