Dear Parish Family-

I had a call and the caller said they heard from a friend of theirs in Howell, who had it on "good authority" that St. Aloysius Church and all the property was sold to the Orthodox Jewish Community. I had to laugh since they called me at the Parish that supposedly doesn't exist anymore! It seems this old trope is a regular rumor in these parts; either we were sold or St. Veronica was sold. Curiously there have been no rumors of St. Monica's being sold or closed! The "Good Authority" was no doubt a parking lot cluster or a sports field group. Maybe it was wishful thinking??? Who knows, some people love to set fires and then watch things burn. Pope Francis speaks out against gossip, innuendo and rumors calling them "evil", now there is a "Good Authority"!!!

Back in September when I last addressed these rumors, I also mentioned that St. Aloysius Church was entering into a lease agreement with a private company whose mission was congruent with the Parish Mission. The announcement was vague as the company had not announced their move to their staff or those they serve and asked me not to say anything specific until they had a chance to make the announcement.

I am pleased to now be able to fully share with you what has happened. We were approached in May by RKS Associates about the possibility of leasing space from us. They were in need of school space and corporate office space. We spent most of the summer exploring this possibility and how this move could potentially benefit them and us.

Four years ago our Parish Offices were moved out of the Bennetts Mills Road big white house and into the old school offices to cut down on expenses. That building was found suitable for RKS Corporate Offices and so we are renting the old Parish Office Building on Bennetts Mills Road to RKS Associates for their corporate offices. They have been renovating the building since September to make it suitable for their needs and will have moved in by November 15.

RKS Associates is a company that provides specialized educational opportunities for individuals with Autism ages 5 to 21. They operate a number of schools across New Jersey. In Jackson they operate one of their schools called Alpha School. They were in need of a suitable building to continue to provide this vital service for those with Autism. They are a leader in services to these individuals and have an excellent track record. The building they are currently occupying was built as a corporate office building and adapted for school use. They are thrilled to be in a building built as a School. They will gain a gym, playground and a kitchen by moving to our location. They will be utilizing the C and D wings as well as the gym, gym kitchen and playground as well as two rooms in the B wing.

We are pleased to enter into this partnership with RKS. We believe their mission of serving those within the Autism spectrum is compatible with our mission. One of their founders is Catholic and they stress the dignity of not only the persons they serve but their employees as well. We are pleased to be able to offer them the space and have worked with them to meet their needs without impinging on our needs.

The parish will retain use of the gym during certain periods of time and use of 3 classrooms, storage, and office space in the B Wing. RKS Associates will be making significant improvements to both the white house and to the C and D wings to make them suitable for their intended use.

These discussions happened late in the year and so we had to figure out a great deal of logistics and scheduling issues related to Religious Education. I am grateful to our Parish Catechetical Leader, Jen Petrillo, for her willingness to work around scheduling issues in the short term. Our planning process is done a year in advance and we were transitioning from an all online program to a hybrid model of family Catechesis so we had to create work arounds to make this possible.

This arrangement will benefit RKS and Alpha to continue serving those on the Autism Spectrum and will financially benefit the parish and continue the educational element for which the building was intended. The lease for both buildings is for a period of 5 years with a possibility for renewal for another 5 years.




