Dear Parish Family-

The American writer, O. Henry said, "Thanksgiving Day is the one day that is purely American". What a great day it is, the whole nation giving thanks to God for the greatest republic in the history of humanity. How blessed we are to have been born here or immigrated here and to live in freedom. Flawed we are, but always striving for a "more perfect union".

This Thanksgiving we are most grateful for Msgr. Joe's more than 20 years of weekend assistance at the parish; made all the more poignant in his leaving us for the next stretch of road on the journey of life. So grateful for the outpouring of support for him from so many upon hearing the news last weekend of his decision to enter transitional living close to his family in Northern New Jersey. Please join us next Sunday after the 10:30am Mass for a farewell breakfast in Morello Hall. There will be gratitude books available for you to leave him a brief heartfelt message.

The work on the roof was delayed due to a material shortage which was supposed to arrive on Tuesday. It is a shame since the weather was excellent, but the roofers worked on three small flat roofs that were part of the project as well. The roofers were ahead of schedule, but the delay in materials has put us back a bit. Progress non-the-less! At least the inside is now dry, for the most part, as the worst leaks were under the sections replaced.

The new doors should be finished when you enter Church this weekend. Each door can be sponsored for a "memorial" or "in honor of". There are a total of 8 doors who are looking for sponsors; a donor gift of \$15,000 per door is requested and a form is in the bulletin. The eight saints depicted are all from the time of Jesus and constitute "firsts". The inside doors depict St. Elizabeth, the relative of the Virgin Mary who visited her after the revelation of the Archangel Gabriel; and, Elizabeth, the first to proclaim Jesus as Lord and Messiah, "Who is it that the Mother of my Lord should come to me". Then, there is St. Paul, the great Apostle to the Gentiles, who is the first new Apostle chosen by Jesus after the resurrection. Next to St. Paul is St. Lydia, the first European to accept Christianity and to be baptized by St. Paul in Greece. Then, St. Mary Magdalene, the first witness and herald of the Resurrection. The outside doors are the first four Apostles, called and chosen by Jesus on the Sea of Galilee; Peter, and his brother Andrew and, James and his brother, John. These four apostles are collectively known as "The First Called".

The next major project will be the electrical and lighting system in the Church once we recover from the current projects costs.

Finally, I leave you with a quote from the American writer/poet Henry Van Dyke, "Gratitude is the inward feeling of kindness received. Thankfulness is the natural impulse to express that feeling. Thanksgiving is the following of that impulse."

Happy Thanksgiving to all! Mass on Thanksgiving Day will be at 8:30am in the Church as no roof work will be taking place that day.




