This Sunday we bid farewell to Msgr. Joe who has been a faithful and steady spiritual guide for countless parishioners over the last twenty plus years. All of us are grateful for his long service to the parish, his gentle manner, his uplifting stories, his passion for justice, and care for the poor. Msgr. Joe has been retired for 23 years but probably did more in freedom of retirement than when he was given assignments in his diocese. His decision to move near his family and into a transitional living community comes at the right time in his life and we can all support his decision and be happy for him! Please join us after the 10:30am Mass Sunday in Morello Hall to bid him farewell and best wishes and to say "thank you." The American Broadcast Journalist, Gemmy Kent, has said, "Gratitude is one of the most powerful human emotions. Once expressed, it changes attitudes, brightens outlook and broadens perspectives." Thank you Msgr. Joe, you will be missed but we are grateful you shared the last two decades of the journey with us, we are better for it!

On Saturday, Nov. 18th, the parish conducted its annual "Turkey Drive." Gratitude and thanks to all the volunteers, planning committee members, and donors that made this year's Turkey Drive a success. A special thank you goes out to our new Captain of the event Dave Furbish and the Men's Group. It requires a lot of coordination and the cooperation of staff, parishioners (who supply the dinners), committee members, St. Vincent de Paul, and the Knights of Columbus to feed 300+ needy families. Thank you to everyone who contributed in any way whether time, talent, or treasure.

The annual "Giving Tree" will go up in the Gathering Space during Advent to assist needy families with Christmas gifts. In the past, these were sent out to local charities. This year, there will be a change. The tags and the items requested will again go to Good Counsel Homes in Riverside and, new this year, to local Jackson area families in need through our St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Good Counsel Homes assists pregnant women in need and provides shelter, prenatal care, classes in parenting, spiritual formation, and other life skills to help homeless mothers and their children journey to a better future. Tags for them will consist of items such as diapers, baby wipes, clothing detergent, clothing items, and personal care supplies. Tags taken from the tree should be returned no later than Friday, December 15<sup>th</sup> to the Gathering Space.

Our St. Vincent dePaul Society experienced a rather large increase in need over the last several months and are challenged to meet this need. To assist them, they will be requesting gift cards and donations which will be directly distributed to needy families. It is hoped that the response will be so great they will have a stock of cards they can distribute over the course of the year and donations to assist in paying rent and utility bills when someone requests assistance. After all, people are not only poor at Thanksgiving and Christmas but year round. Gift cards and donations should be brought to the parish office. Please do not leave them in the Gathering Space.

So rise up St. Aloysius parishioners and fulfill the Christmas need to help mothers and children and the St. Vincent dePaul Society to stock up for the coming months, thus spreading the Christmas spirit across the whole year!!!


