Dear Parish Family-

Our Parish Finance Committee composed of 7 parishioners, myself and the Business Manager met on Sunday Nov. 14 from 9:30am-11:45am. We discussed the three mortgages held on the New Church which total 4.2 Million Dollars. The two large mortgages have been restructured to be interest and principal loans, previously these were set up as principal only loans. The third mortgage has come due and we are currently negotiating a change in terms from a principal only to a principal and interest loan. The loans were all originally set up as interest only loans which mean the amount we owed stayed the same and thousands of dollars in interest were paid yearly. As these loans have reached their terms I have moved them to new lenders with lower interest rates, better terms and principal payments being made to bring the loans down. They stood at over 6 million eight years ago. They were brought under 5 Million once before but the school needed roofs so money was added, bringing the amount owned to over 5 million. We are once again under 5 Million and almost under 4 million, however the roof of the Old Church has reached the end of its life and the roof on the New Church has leaked since before the building was occupied in 2009 and has become progressively and aggressively worse over time. We have hired a Roofing Consultant to examine the roofs, give a report and make recommendations, handle the bidding process and supervision of the new installation. We are at the beginning of this process but I anticipate the costs to be significant.

The Finance Committee also discussed the issue of the parish debt. For the first time in many years we are in debt due to several factors; exodus of many Catholic Families from Jackson, changing demographics, secularization of society, the Pandemic lock-down when we had minimal income for many months, the slow pandemic recovery where we have reduced income now, increases in expenses from 5%-18% on many goods and services coupled with a decline in revenue and subsidy of Mother Seton Academy. All of these factors together have contributed to our inability to pay our bills. We often pay one bill and shift another off for another day. As the saying goes we, "rob Peter to pay Paul".

When our Youth Minister, Joey Tun, moved to Texas we were very saddened but it also means one less salary and benefit package to pay. I do believe Youth Ministry is essential for a vibrant parish. For now we are not filling the position and shifting staff responsibilities to cover Youth Ministry, doing more with less essentially.

The Finance Committee recommended an increased offering campaign. So I am asking you to consider increasing your weekly offering by \$10, this was the amount the Finance Committee Members suggested. So for example, if you give \$5.00 a week would you consider increasing it to \$15.00. All of this is just a suggestion, they felt a simple increase of \$10.00 per family was reasonable and doable for most families in the parish and would bring greater financial stability to the Parish. The Finance Committee was unanimous in expressing that our families will always respond for the good of the parish and are generous people when a need is identified and the Pastor makes the request. So I ask you to prayerfully consider this suggestion of your fellow parishioners who are charged with stewardship of our common resources. Thank you for considering this suggestion, whatever increase you may decide, based on your own means, would be gratefully accepted. Some families may be able to give more, while other less and still others nothing at all. Whatever you can do is appreciated and responsibly monitored.

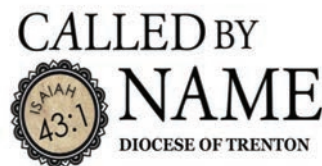

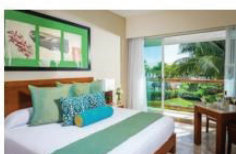
