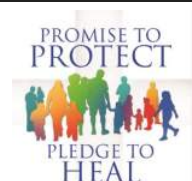

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend is the First Sunday of Advent, hard to believe Thanksgiving is over, and Christmas is around the corner. Since it is the beginning of the Catholic New Liturgical Year, the beginning of the Year of Grace 2026, I thought it would be good to give you an update on our debt status. I have not done this in quite a while.

The parish is financially solvent, and we stay more or less on budget each year. There continues to be a demographic shift in the Township, with more Catholic Families moving out. Over the last several years, we have been losing about 100 families a year; however, last year, we lost only about 20 registered families. This was a bit of an interesting statistic since we lost families; however, the number of registered people was greater than the prior year. That indicates while we lost registered households, the number of people in the parish's households increased. So the number of registered households decreased, but the number of registered persons increased. The downside is that collections have been slightly down. The good news is that the income from the two leased properties helps pay our mortgages. Here are the loan balances as of 11/01/25:

Loan 1: \$2,096,372.09 (\$5,675.00/month)

This is a consolidated loan for the replacement of roofs on the C and D wings of the School, the Old Church, the garage, the White House, and the New Church.

Loan 2: \$1,270,668.16 (\$12,695.29/month)

This is one of three loans for the building of the New Church. We have paid off an additional \$304,686.96 in principal from Mortgage Reduction Envelope donations, which represent a cut of 24 months off the life of the loan.

Loan 3: 1,785,991.71 (\$5,059.47/month)

This is one of three loans for the building of the New Church.

Loan 4: \$37,724.79 (\$2,762.48/month)

This is one of three loans for the building of the new Church. This loan has 13 payments left. The payoff would be \$36,774.87; the \$949.92 difference is the interest we will pay over the course of the year. After paying off this loan, we would redirect an additional \$2,000.00 per month toward paying off the \$1,270,668.16 loan.

Current total Loan debt stands at \$5,190,756.75 with monthly payments totaling \$26,192.24.

If anyone is thinking about what to do with their year-end charitable donation or RMD, please consider earmarking it for loan #4. It would be beneficial if we could pay off the \$36,774.87 balance of this loan. So, folks, if you can muster an extra donation toward loan #4, and if we could raise \$36.7k by the end of December, we could get rid of one mortgage, allowing us to start making extra principal payments on the other loans, making a greater dent in our overall debt.

The elimination of these mortgages has been my primary focus over the last 13 years, and we have made great strides. At times though, it is two steps forward and one step back. We lower the loans, then some costly repair to our aging facilities, or the catastrophic failure of a system in the New Church occurs, increasing our mortgages as we have to borrow the money for the repairs.

The elimination of these loans is essential to the long-term health of this parish. Without this debt, our parish would be in very good shape, but most of our income goes to paying mortgages. These mortgages are a heavy weight on the parish. For those new to the parish, I did not create these debts; I inherited them, and I am determined to keep us financially solvent and healthy. The future of our parish's health and growth require us to pay off these debts. I cannot emphasize this point enough.

Jackson is undoubtedly changing; 3 public schools closed, and the remaining were reorganized; two school buildings have been or will be sold in the near future. You can certainly do the math!

So if you can muster a year-end charitable contribution or an RMD toward eliminating the smallest loan of \$36.7K that would be a wonderful gift, a gift not just to the present but to the future of our parish.

You were very generous in helping our Youth Group attend the National Youth Conference. We sent 10; they went last Wednesday as part of the Diocesan Delegation on a full bus that sat 54 people. Our parish was one of the 10 of the 54. There are 97 parishes in the Diocese.

May your Advent be one of reflection, joy, and anticipation for the Nativity of the Lord.

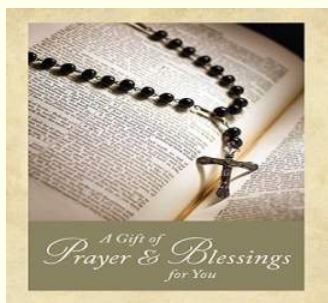

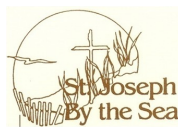

Sacrament of MATRIMONY - We welcome and congratulate all who are seeking the Sacrament of Matrimony. Church arrangements and marriage preparation should be made one year in advance for those who are registered with the parish and living in Jackson. Call the parish office as soon as possible at 732-370-0500 ext. 204. If you are making plans for a "destination wedding," please call the parish office first. There is a way to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony before your destination wedding.

MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION - The Convalidation of a Marriage is a special wedding ceremony by which one's marriage is recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church. Through this process your marriage will be fully embraced by the Church, granting it all the spiritual blessings and benefits it offers. If you are interested in learning more about a Marriage Convalidation contact the parish office.

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To begin the process of scheduling a date for Baptism, families are asked to be registered in the parish. Parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism Prep Class, and Godparents will need to provide a Letter of Eligibility from their current parish (where they reside). Baptisms are held most Sundays at 12:00pm, following the 10:30am Mass. For more information or to schedule a date, please call the parish office. No Baptism date can be secured until all requirements are met.



Why register with a parish?

Registering with a parish allows for a more personal connection with the church community, helps the parish plan for its needs, and is often necessary for receiving sacraments, acting as a godparent, or receiving a donation statement. It provides a sense of belonging and commitment to the faith community and enables the parish to better minister to you, especially during important life events or times of need.

If you've been attending Mass, and a Jackson resident, but have not formally registered with us, contact the parish office to receive a Parish Registration Form or pick one up from an Usher at Sunday Mass. Please keep in mind, only registered parishioners are eligible for sponsor letters.
