Dear Parish Family-

The new Church doors, installed by Baut Studios, were completed on Friday, Nov. 17, 2023. The automatic handicap door work is done by a separate company, under a separate contract, and could not be done until Baut finished their work. The automatic handicap door installation company ran wiring on Friday, Nov. 17th but, had not installed the mechanisms on each door. The following week was a shortened work week due to Thanksgiving. Hopefully when you read this, the work will have been completed.

Please DO NOT prop open or chock the doors. This is a violation of the fire code and causes a dangerous situation in the event of a fire. Additionally, it causes problems with the heating of the Church causing the meter to spin off the building as our boilers cannot heat the parking lot. Baut Studios warned me about parishioners propping open the doors, it will cause them to fail. They installed doors on another parish, gave the same warning and the first week someone ignored the pastor and bent the door and the frame. They had to replace the entire door at the parish expense; it was used one time. These doors are lighter and easier to open than the previous set. Open them like you would any other door. Ask yourself this question, "Do you prop open your doors in winter? Have mercy on our finances!

Thank you to the Knights of Columbus for the fine farewell to Msgr. Joe last weekend. The Knights are very busy with many projects and we appreciate their help in organizing and carrying off the lunch last week. The parish has a good relationship with the Knights.

Speaking of the Knights, I am often asked where clothing can be dropped off. The Knights of Columbus have several clothing bins at their Council home on Bartley Road. The Co-Cathedral of St. Robert in Freehold has Catholic Charity bins in their parking lot as well. Take your pick. The parish does NOT accept clothing, household goods or furniture. For furniture or household goods try Habitat Re-Store in Freehold or Toms River. The Diocesan Saint Vincent de Paul Society also runs Vincent's Legacy in Wall (they will pick up furniture, but nothing from smokers or households with pets) 609-557-7837.

Our parish chapter of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, along with Good Counsel Homes, is the beneficiaries of the Giving Tree this year. Good Counsel Homes has specific gifts, St. Vincent dePaul is asking for gift cards or donations for electric/gas/oil/water for their guests; the amount can be found on the tags. While most of this will be immediately distributed at Christmas, St. Vincent dePaul's hope is to receive such an abundance that will last through part of, or all of the year (hope springs eternal!). After all, the poor are not just poor at Thanksgiving and Christmas! The Society has seen a significant uptick in guests asking for assistance this year and funds are low, if you can please be generous!

As it is the end of the year, many people are looking for tax deductions or will be required to make RMD's , please consider the parish. We have many needs. The cost of the roof was done on credit, another loan. The roof cost 1.5 Million! Yikes! The doors can be memorialized for a deceased member or in honor of someone for a donation of \$15,000 per door. We still have to tackle the electrical problems in the Church affecting the lighting system.
