## Dear Parish Family-

This Sunday marks the second Sunday of Advent. Advent is a very short liturgical season in preparation for Christmas. It is a 'little lent'. Due to the secularization of society it is also a very hectic time where our culture celebrates a nebulous 'holiday' season while rejecting the reason for the season – the birth of Jesus Christ. As a Christian I find this offensive, while society rejects religion with increasing force, it uses our sacred season to promote materialism, consumerism and economic gain.

As Christians we are not immune from cultural pressures, most of us will put up lights and decorate our homes during the secular holiday season from Oct. 31-Dec. 25<sup>th</sup> and contribute to the frenetic shopping the media pushes. While some of this may be necessary we do not have to abandon our religious beliefs entirely or lose sight of the true meaning of Advent and why it is important to prepare our souls for Christmas. Moderation is the ideal. So take time to reflect on the state of your soul. Keeping ever in mind the Christian Christmas Season does not begin until the evening of Dec. 24 and concludes on the Solemnity of Epiphany. Use Advent to prepare for Christ's coming at Christmas and to reflect on His second coming, as we pray in Advent "Maranatha" – Come, Lord Jesus.

Preparations are underway for the opening of the public phase of the Diocesan phase of the World Synod of Bishops. Pastors have been asked to assemble a team of 3 parishioners to assist them at the parish level of the Synodal process. I have invited Denis Campbell, Kerry Muller and Pam Di Riso and all three have accepted.

Pastors and their teams were asked to attend an Orientation Meeting in November and there is an additional team training taking place this month. It appears the Synod process is underway and on schedule. It is reasonable to expect the public listening sessions will take place sometime in either January or February as has previously been announced.

To that end, we are making a few changes to how you can make your online donations. We are excited to announce that we have transitioned the new ParishSOFT Giving platform. This program allows for an easier experience for you, as well as for the parish office. Click on the GIVING tab in the blue bar at the top of the page and then on the red Donate Today button.

For all active recurring donors, we have transitioned your recurring gifts from our prior eGiving platform, My Own Giving, over to ParishSOFT Giving. When logging in for the first time, it is important to <u>use the same email address</u> as your original My Own Giving account and follow the set-up steps below. Your previous recurring gift in My Own Giving was cancelled automatically when we moved to ParishSOFT Giving and your recurring gift will now be processed in our new system at the same frequency and amount as before. Once you login to the new system you will be able to manage any recurring gifts that are active for you.

Don't have a recurring gift scheduled? Not a problem! Creating a donor account and setting up a one time gift in ParishSOFT Giving is easy. Follow the set-up steps below to create your new online giving account by visiting the Donate Now link on our website.



The 2021 holiday season kicked off with our 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Thanksgiving Dinner Drive on Nov.20. Due to Covid, we again had a much reduced event, with only six adult and four teen volunteers working and a limited number of dinners for distribution. Dinners were picked up by 133 St Vincent de Paul guests; the excess of 177 dinners was delivered to Cath-

olic Charities in Lakewood. Additionally, again because of Covid, we asked the K of C to bypass our parking lot and deliver their donation of 25 dinners directly to Catholic Charities, while a parishioner delivered 40 dinners directly to the Jackson Food Pantry. The total number of dinners was 375. Because of our Covid-limited Drive this year, we requested that in lieu of dinners Donors provide gift cards or checks to benefit the less fortunate of Jackson. Wow! Our Donors responded wonderfully and donated \$9100!

There is one story that must be told about the day of the Drive. It occurred last year and again this year. As a guest received his dinner, he handed an envelope to one of our volunteers and remarked that he wanted to give a little back for all that he had received. In the envelope was \$20. What an incredible act of generosity on his part!
