Dear Parish Family,



This weekend we move into the second Sunday and week of Advent, marking it by lighting the second candle of the Advent Wreath. The Advent Wreath is not a requirement, but a custom of Advent and comes to us from the German tradition. The wreath is always made from evergreens, which as the name implies, stays green all year long never losing their needles, thus reminding us that faith is *ever green*. The wreath is round, reminding us God is without beginning or end, and the cycle of the Church year continuously celebrates the mysteries of Christ's redemption. The four candles represent each week of the season. Today, and in days of old, the darkness comes early and we must illumine the darkness with light, Christ is the light of the world. We share in that light placing our candles on the bushel basket, not under it, so that the light of our goodness chases the darkness away.

Advent has some very nice feasts: St. Nicholas on December 6th (Friday); Immaculate Conception on December 8th (this year celebrated on December 9th); Our Lady of Loreto, December 10th; Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12th; St. Lucy on December 13th. Three of these are Feast Days of the Blessed Virgin Mary, appropriate for a season which directs our attention the expectant waiting with Mary in the final day of her pregnancy. St. Nicolas was the Bishop of Myra, what is today Turkey; he saved three impoverished girls by providing a dowry to their father, and thus is remembered for his charity. He also saved some sailors by calming an angry sea by his prayers and is invoked as patron of sailors and all who travel on the sea. It is the custom to place your shoes outside your door; St. Nicholas comes during the night, and fills them with sweets or chocolates. He was buried in Myra, where he was bishop, and his remains were later transferred to Bari, Italy where a great shrine is built over his tomb.

St. Lucy was an early Christian Virgin Martyr from Syracuse, Italy who died by having her eyes gouged out. She is often rather dramatically portrayed holding a tray with her eyeballs on it. She is the patron saint of those who suffer eye ailments; her name literally means "light". When the Holy Year begins, the mascot is a little "Luci" (LOO-Chay). The custom in Europe is for girls to wear white with an evergreen crown with white candles lit, bringing their parents breakfast sweets and singing hymns to honor St. Lucy. Her body is kept in Venice in a glass sarcophagus, covering her face is a silver death mask which was a gift from Pope St. John XXIII, who before he was elected pope, was the Patriarch of Venice and had a devotion to her.

Of all the Marion Feasts, the one that is beloved here in the Americas is Our Lady of Guadalupe, who appeared in a series of visions to the 57 year old widower, the Mesoamerican native, Juan Diego in 1531. She spoke to him in his native Nahuatl language and dressed as an Aztec Princess on Tepeyac Hill. She told him, "I am the Mother of the one true God." She asked him to give a message to the local Bishop Juan de Zumarraga, OFM, saying she wished a chapel to be built on Tepeyac Hill in her honor as "Coatlaxopeuh" (the one who crushes the serpent). The bishop was skeptical about the story so the Virgin Mary sent Juan Diego back to the bishop with proof. He was to cut the roses blooming on Tepeyac Hill (roses did not bloom at this time), and fill his tilma (an inexpensive cloth covering worn by the poor) with the roses. When Juan Diego knelt before the bishop and opened his tilma, the roses spilled out and the bishop saw the image of the Aztec Princess imprinted on the cloth. St. Juan Diego did not speak Spanish, but when he said the woman was "Coatlaxopeuh", the bishop heard a word that sounded similar in Spanish to "Guadalupe", the name of a well known shrine to the Virgin Mary in his native Spain. The image is preserved in a great shrine in Mexico City; the most visited Marian Shrine in the world.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.


