We enter the Third Sunday of Advent, where the Penitential color of violet lightens to rose. We light the rose candle on the Advent Wreath and the vestments are rose colored. Traditionally, this Sunday is called "Gaudete Sunday", meaning "to rejoice", taken from the Introit of the Mass, "Gaudete in Domino semper", "Rejoice in the Lord Always", which comes from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians 4:4-6. The focus of the liturgy changes from "the Lord is coming" to the "Lord is near". Advent was once a longer period starting on St. Martin's Day, November 12<sup>th</sup>, and nicknamed "St. Martin's Lent".


Advent was shortened to its current four week period around the year 850AD. St. Gregory the Great would further form Advent as a four week liturgical cycle in the 12<sup>th</sup> Century. It also mirrored Lent as a smaller penitential season. During Lent, the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday is called "Laetare Sunday" where rose is also used.

The French Theologian, Jean Cardinal Danielou, compared the Advent season to life, "We live always during Advent. We are always waiting for the Messiah to come. The Messiah has come, but is not yet fully manifest. The Messiah is not fully manifest in each of our souls, not fully manifest in humankind as a whole: that is to say, that just as Christ was born according to the flesh in Bethlehem of Judah, so must he be born according to the spirit in each soul."

During this third week of Lent, Latino communities begin the joyful celebration of "Las Posadas", which starts on December 16th through Midnight Christmas Eve, and is believed to have begun in Mexico in 1587. Las Posadas literally means "the shelters". Each night "pilgrims" make their way through the streets, with Mary and Joseph, knocking on doors seeking shelter. The celebrations include foods of tamales, donuts, champurrado, and buffets of food. The pilgrims carry lanterns with them, representing the stars, which illuminate the way for the shepherds who make their way to the house of Jesus' birth. An angel leads them as they sing and dance their way to a door with Joseph and Mary; the owner of the house opens the door, and becomes the inn keeper of Bethlehem, offering food and shelter. The meaning is that when Jesus knocks, we open the door; you open the door of your heart to offer shelter, we shelter Jesus by doing good works, practicing virtues, and coming together with neighbors. Las Posadas is another wonderful Advent custom.

Therefore, when the Lord comes knocking in the dark night at the door of your heart, open it with your good works and virtues, which illuminate the path to joy.







In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
