Merry Christmas to all of you from everyone on our Pastoral Staff. We wish you a blessed holiday and Blessed New Year!

The coming New Year brings the Alpha School to the C & D wings and gym starting in January. They will be leasing the property for the next 5 years. They have done extensive renovations to the wings to make them suitable for their educational operations. They are also leasing 2 classrooms in the B Wing to be used as administrative offices. We welcome them to our facility.

RKS Associates moved into the white house on Bennetts Mills Road in November after extensive renovations to that building to make it suitable for their corporate operations and are also leasing for 5 years.

The Parish Offices moved out of that building in 2017, to consolidate expenses, and moved into the old school offices. For the last 5 years the building has been essentially closed but due to the renovation work people started going there for Mass cards, sponsor letters and the like. Please let your friends know we are not there and have not been there for along time. Those are now leased Corporate Offices, RKS has posted signs at the entrances noting it is not a Church Office.

I have to be honest, it's rather embarrassing that people go there after 5 years! Tell your lapsed friends we have moved to the school!

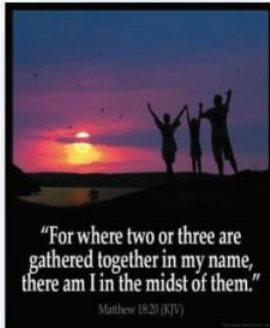

Why Register at a Parish?

*Your Parish Needs **You** and you **Need** Your Parish!!!*

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be a part of a Catholic Faith community. If you have recently moved to Jackson or if you are a life-long Jackson resident, please consider registering at the parish. Just fill out a Parish Registration Form which can be obtained in Church, at the parish office or on our website www.saintalloysiusonline.org. Completed forms can be dropped off at the parish office or emailed it to us at parishoffice@saintalloysiusonline.org

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identify in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so we can provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use collection envelopes or online giving you may request a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address, email or phone number. ***Only registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent letters.***
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.

What about children who are 18 years of age or older?

Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18 it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and to register as a member independent of their parents.
