Dear Parish Family-

Merry Christmas and Blessed New Year!

Thank you for your generosity to the Parish, the Poor, the hungry and the Seminarians in Uganda, and to your priests.

I want to give you an update on the Diocesan Phase of the World Synod of Bishops. During the month of December myself, Sherri Kroesch, Jen Petrillo, Pat Mulholland, Joe Campbell, Kerry Muller and Pan DeRiso all attended an Orientation held at St. Robert Co-Cathedral in Freehold. We learned how the Diocese is structuring the process.

There are essentially two parts to the Diocesan Phase. The first part parishes will undertake and the second part the Diocese will undertake. The Parish Phase will begin with 'Focus Groups'. Parishes will invite from existing ministries, committees and organizations 6 people to come to a Listening Session. At the listening sessions, each focus group of 6 people will be led by a Facilitator who has been trained and, along with this person will be a 'note taker' who will record what was said. These Listening Sessions will be structured so that each person in the group will answer the question the presenter asks, each person in the group will listen to the response, there will be silent reflection and prayer, and the note taker will record what they hear. The notes of the note taker will be sent to the Diocese. These sessions will take place during the months of January, February, and March.

The second part will be Listening Sessions the Diocese will offer to the general public, Catholics who have left the Church, Ecumenical partners and Interfaith partners. The sessions will be announced by the Diocese and will be held in various locations across the Diocese during January, February and March. They will be led by trained professionals.

At the Parish level we will be inviting those already involved in Church life and the Diocese will gather those who are not part of Church life. This seems to be a good working model for gathering a wide variety of reflections from a diverse group of people.

The key to the Synodal Process is "LISTENING". The Bishop has emphasized that the Holy Father wants us to listen to each other and each other's journey of faith. The Holy Father wants us to seriously reflect on what it means to be Church today, how we arrived at where we are and, where we think we are going or where we think we ought to be going. Essential to this Spiritual Journey of Faith is being open to the movement of the Holy Spirit in our own life and the life of the Community of Faith. That means we have to dedicate time to personal prayer for the Synod, for one another and for the Church.

The Parish Team also attended training sessions on "Spiritual Conversations" using the Ignatian Model (the way of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits) in preparation for the Listening Sessions. This will be the structured model used during the Listening Sessions. It is a time tested model based on Ignatian Spirituality.

The first months of 2022 are teeing up to looking pretty busy and exciting! Come Holy Spirit! Please keep praying the Prayer for the Synod!! On this Feast of the Holy Family let us pray to be a Holier Church Family!

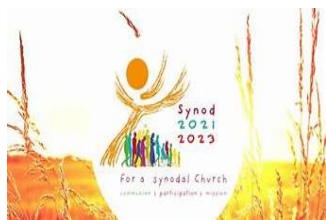

We NEED you.
Can you HELP?

On December 14th, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., conveyed an appeal from leaders in the United State of Conference of Catholic Bishops as relief work begins in Kentucky and other states that suffered an incalculable toll from the recent outbreak of tornadoes. Bishop O'Connell shared, "Catholics are encouraged to donate to recovery efforts and financial help for tornado victims by supporting the work of Catholic Charities USA via the website www.catholiccharities.us." He added, "We pray for the souls of those who have died; for the comfort of their grieving loved ones; for the healing of the injured, and for the strength and perseverance of all those who lost their homes and livelihoods."

On the weekend of December 4th and 5th, I announced at all the Masses that in place of the Giving Tree we would have a box in front of the Statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus as you enter Church with a sign that says, "Funds for Food for Ugandan Seminarians". Due to the pandemic the young men studying for the priesthood cannot leave the compound to go home at breaks and holidays and this has created a critical situation as all 230 students plus faculty and staff must be fed daily. Food is something we take for granted and it is abundant and plentiful in America but in many parts of the world this is not the case, particularly in Africa. Fr. Lazarus is struggling to provide food for these men. It costs the Seminary 5 million Uganda Shillings a week to feed 230+ people which is approximately \$1,300 US dollars a week. So for Advent, we are asking for funds to provide food for the Seminarians at Ggaba Seminary in Uganda. Checks should be made out to St. Aloysius Church and we ask that you write "Funds for Food Uganda " in the memo line and also on the envelope if you mail it or drop off at the office or Church. You have already raised 3.5 + week's worth of meals.

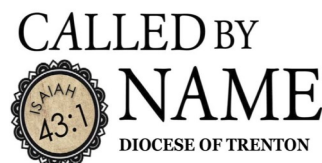

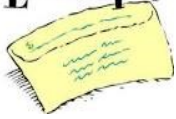

The new hymnals have arrived! *Please do not remove them from the Church.* If you would like your own personal copy, contact the parish office. Hymnals are \$25 each.



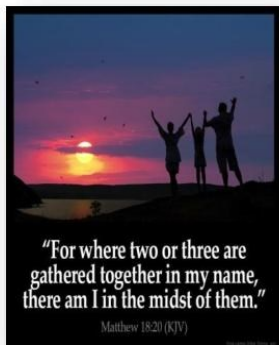

Why Register at a Parish?

*Your Parish Needs **You** and you **Need** Your Parish!!!*

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be a part of a Catholic Faith community. If you have recently moved to Jackson or if you are a life-long Jackson resident, please consider registering at the parish. You can pick up a form in Church or the parish office or visit our website www.saintaloyusonline.org and download the form, fill it out and email it to us at parishoffice@saintaloyusonline.org

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identify in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so we can provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use collection envelopes or online giving you may request a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address, email or phone number. ***Only registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent letters.***
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.

What about children who are 18 years of age or older?

Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. One they are 18 it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and to register as a member independent of their parents.

If you are not registered as a parishioner yet, or are unsure of your status, please complete and submit a Parish Registration Form which can be found in Church, at the parish office or downloaded via the parish website.
