Dear Parish Family,

The Solemnity of Christmas brings families and friends together from far and wide. Some folks have families they were born into, while others form families with close friends for one reason or another. What is certain is that family is important to us regardless if it is one of birth or affection. Family life provides joy, connection, faith, values, morals, support and uplift to life.

Following Christmas are a blizzard of feasts starting with December 26<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of St. Stephen, the first saint and martyr of the Church, followed by the youngest, and only Apostle not to die from Martyrdom, St. John the Evangelist, followed by the Holy Innocents, and then, today's Solemnity of the Holy Family. Thus, the liturgical year connects the dots from the birth of Jesus for a singular purpose, to die on the Cross and rise from the dead for our salvation, to the first person to willingly die for that faith then, the feast of the Holy Innocents, whom King Herod ordered killed in his vain attempt to stop Jesus before he even got started.


We then move on to this Solemnity of the Holy Family, celebrating Jesus, Mary, and Joseph and their domestic life, their example of love for one another, and their patience. The New Testament does not whitewash their domestic life. It highlights the ups and downs of their domestic life, it hints at the sorrow of Mary and Jesus when St. Joseph dies. Their family life mirrors our family life, theirs may have been more tranquil, but their joy is our joy, their struggle our struggle, their hopes our hopes. The Holy Family stands as a witness to all that is good about family life. They offer us a powerful example to inspire our own family journeys.

Pope St. John Paul II taught that "The future of humanity passes by way of the family." Pope Benedict XVI taught, "The family...is the 'patrimony of humanity'...it is the vital cell and pillar of society." Pope Francis teaches us the family is, "the fundamental cell of society" and the Synod

on Synodality taught, "We remain firmly convinced that the family is a gift of God, the place where he reveals the power of his saving grace."

Sacrament of ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to

sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.




