INSTRUCTIONS CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) AND LITURGICAL PRACTICES

In light of the escalating concern about the spread of the coronavirus (COVID_19), **Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M.**, has issued the following instructions on liturgical practices to be observed in **ALL parishes**, institutions and organizations within the Diocese of Trenton, effective immediately until otherwise notified:

1. People who have flu-like symptoms or who are otherwise feeling sick should not go to Mass or other Church gatherings;
2. Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should practice good hygiene, washing hands with soap and water or anti-bacterial hand sanitizer, before and after distributing Holy Communion;
3. People are *encouraged* not to receive communion on the tongue; worthy, reverent reception by hand is preferred until otherwise notified;
4. The practice of distributing the Precious Blood from the Chalice is suspended;
5. The practice of exchanging the sign of peace by any physical contact (handshake, embrace, kissing) is suspended.

Dear Parish Family,

We enter into the second week of Lent. Lent invites us to increase our prayer life. Increasing our prayer might look like saying the Rosary each day, making the Stations of the Cross, making a Novena, adding morning and evening prayer to our day, making the Divine Mercy Novena at 3pm or some other form of formal prayer. It may also look like adding a few moments of meditation each day on a passage from the Bible. Many of the Saints would simply open their Bible and see what God wanted to reveal to them that day. Maybe consider reading one or all four of the Gospels over the course of Lent. Practicing Lection Divina, meditating on particular line from Scripture. Going on a retreat or doing a day of recollection, consider: Francis House of prayer in Allentown, <http://www.fhop.org/> or St. Joseph by the Sea, <http://www.sjbsea.org/> or St. Alphonsus in Long Branch, <https://www.sanalfonsoretreats.org/> or Maris Stella in Harvey Cedars LBI, <http://www.marisstella.org/> these are all fairly close but there are many other in New Jersey.

How about making spiritual pilgrimage, within a reasonable drive; the National Shrine to Our Lady of Fatima in Washington, NJ, <https://www.bluearmy.com> or Padre Pio Shrine in Landisville, NJ (open 24hrs!), <https://www.stpadrepioshninenj.org/> or The Shrine of St. Joseph in Sterling NJ, <https://www.shrineofsaintjoseph.com/>. A little further out but doable is the Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in beautiful Doylestown PA, <https://czestochowa.us/>.

You could add the Jesus Prayer to your day. This is an ancient prayer that dates at least as far back as St. John Casian in the Desert of the 4th and 5th Centuries. Once it was a prayer of the whole Church but today it is mostly prayed by Eastern Catholics. It is a simple prayer which is repeated: "*Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner*". The shortness of the words contains the whole of what our relationship with God should be and is perfect for the Penitential Season of Lent. There is no prescribed amount of times to say it. Some suggest 10 or 15 minutes a day, others use a prayer rope with knots, or rosary beads will work too. The amount of time or number of times is not important. It is easy to memorize and can be done in the car, at work, or anytime. Maybe morning, noon and night, simply repeating the prayer to yourself.

These are but a few suggestions among many. The important thing is to increase our prayer, fast from something we enjoy ("giving up something for Lent") and Almsgiving; increasing our charity to be mindful of the poor and less fortunate.

On another note, the 100 year old Indiana Limestone Altar of Repose installation has been delayed further due to scheduling issues. It is anticipated that the new time frame for the installation will be after Easter. It was tentatively scheduled for the week of March 9 but proved too difficult for the company due to other projects. When I have a firm date I will publish it.

A Statement from our Pastor, Very Rev. John P. Bambrick, V.F.

A matter relating to the preparedness of a special needs child in St. Aloysius Parish to receive First Holy Communion has generated a great deal of confusion and concern, which I would like to address.

While we had tried to adapt our preparation process to accommodate the child's special needs, there was an unfortunate breakdown in communication that led to a misunderstanding. A delay in receiving the Sacrament was discussed until readiness could be assessed; there was never to be denial of Communion to this child.

With the guidance and support of Bishop David O'Connell, we were able to discern a way for the child to receive First Holy Communion without any delay. We have made the family aware of this development and hope to be able to meet with them to discuss it. Their child continues to be welcome in our program, and will be able to receive First Holy Communion this year.

I regret that this matter evolved as it did and, for our part, acknowledge that it could have been handled differently. It is extremely unfortunate that, as a result of this controversy, there are families with special needs children who may now doubt the Church's commitment to welcome all children into their religious education programs. Nothing could be further from the truth; special needs children and adults are welcomed and ministered to in parishes across this Diocese, and throughout the Church, including this parish.

DIocese ISSUES ADVISORY ON CORONAVIRUS CONCERNS

With federal health officials issuing recent warnings about the potential spread of the coronavirus in the United States, and news coming in from around the globe about extreme measures to stem the spread, the Diocese of Trenton has issued the following instructions:



The Diocese has always advised the faithful that sickness is a valid reason not to attend Mass or other Church gatherings where large groups assemble. At Mass, no member of the faithful is obliged: (1) to shake hands at the sign of peace; (2) to receive the Precious Blood of Christ from the chalice; (3) to receive the Body of Christ on the tongue unless that is his/her preference.

With the concerns about the coronavirus, the faithful are encouraged to take all the same precautions they would follow regarding the flu. Use normal good judgment. If you are sick or have flu-like symptoms, stay home. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is broadcast on several television channels, and the sick can make a "spiritual communion" until they return to good health.

CENSUS CRITICAL TO UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES

As the nation gears up for the 2020 U.S. Census, a process that unfolds in most states in mid-March and continues through this July, the stakes are high for all to participate. Church leaders remind the faithful that crucial decisions about government-funded programs and representation are made based on updated census data.

James King, interim director of the New Jersey Catholic Conference, emphasized that in addition to ensuring proper funding amounts for services, census information also determines the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Rep-



resentatives and is used to redraw congressional and state legislative districts. After the 2010 census, he pointed out, New Jersey lost a seat in the House of Representatives.

The loss of representation and the loss of funding negatively affects citizens, especially those from underserved and vulnerable populations, stressed Brenda Rascher, diocesan executive director of Catholic Social Services.

"We need people to understand that the state has lost funding in the past because of the census. So if we don't get it right, it will be 10 years before we can fix it," she said.

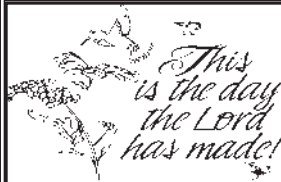
