## **INSTRUCTIONS CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) AND LITURGICAL PRACTICES**

In light of the escalating concern about the spread of the coronavirus (COVID\_19), **Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M.**, has issued the following instructions on liturgical practices to be observed in ALL parishes, institutions and organizations within the Diocese of Trenton, effective immediately until otherwise notified:

1. People who have flu-like symptoms or who are otherwise feeling sick should not go to Mass or other Church gatherings;
2. Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should practice good hygiene, washing hands with soap and water or anti-bacterial hand sanitizer, before and after distributing Holy Communion;
3. People are *encouraged* not to receive communion on the tongue; worthy, reverent reception by hand is preferred until otherwise notified;
4. The practice of distributing the Precious Blood from the Chalice is suspended;
5. The practice of exchanging the sign of peace by any physical contact (handshake, embrace, kissing) is suspended.

Dear Parish Family-

I hope this message finds you well in these times of pandemic as the family of humanity fights the COVID-19 Virus.

By now you have read that our Co-Cathedral and neighbor, St. Robert Bellarmine in Freehold, is closed for the month of March. A family event took place there and two of those in attendance have died (as of this writing) and many more became infected, some critically.

It is so important for all of us to maintain good hygiene by washing our hands frequently with soap and water for 30 seconds and keeping our homes, work, cars, everything as sanitary as possible. Keep our hands away from touching our faces and practice "Social Distancing". Most important is not to have bodily contact with one another and avoid gatherings of more than 25 people. Fundamentally stay at home!

Our parish Church will remain open daily until 1:00pm for private prayer. Bishop O'Connell issued a decree on Monday March 16 prohibiting the public celebration of Mass until April 3 but mandating priests to fulfill all Mass intentions as a matter of justice. Therefore myself and Fr. Jim will offer private Mass daily and private Masses on the weekend for all the Mass intentions. Please consult our website as this decree may be extended depending on the public health threat.

**Every Catholic in the Diocese of Trenton has been dispensed from the Obligation to attend Mass by Bishop O'Connell until further notice.**

All parish activities, meetings and events are cancelled until further notice and our building, with the exception of the Church, are closed. Parish Offices will be closed to visitors from March 16 until March 27 however staff will be available by phone or e-mail during regular hours. Mother Seton Academy and St. Aloysius Religious Education are closed until March 27. All of these may be extended on short notice, please check our website for updates.

In the bulletin this weekend are two prayers you are invited to pray daily during this pandemic.

May the Mother of God watch over and protect us all!

### **Message from Bishop O'Connell On Measures to Mitigate the Spread of COVID-19 March 16, 2020.**

God has not abandoned us and is present among us. As we learn each day of the growing concern surrounding the spread of the coronavirus in our communities, we need to have faith and confidence in God, especially in times like these, praying that He will see us through the present adversity safely.

Mindful of the Lord Jesus' own words in St. Luke's Gospel, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his Cross daily, and follow me (Luke 9: 23)," the coronavirus pandemic has placed such a Cross before us.

In response to the latest guidelines from national and state health authorities aimed at stopping the spread of the disease, I have directed the following:

#### **MASSES, SACRAMENTS AND OTHER CHURCH SERVICES**

- All public Masses throughout the Diocese of Trenton will be temporarily suspended through April 3, 2020. That date is subject to change as the coronavirus pandemic evolves.
- Baptism, funerals and weddings may continue based on the judgement of pastors, with the caution that crowds should not exceed 50 persons as mandated by the State of New Jersey.
- Social distancing practices (3-6 feet of space between participants) should be observed for any event inside church spaces.
- Churches should remain open for prayer, private devotion and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Pastors are asked to consider Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament during the day. Praying in large groups, however, should be avoided.
- Attention should be paid to the cleanliness of our church facilities.
- Televised or online celebrations of the Mass and other religious programming are available for use of the faithful during this time.
- All scheduled Confirmations in the Diocese will be temporarily postponed until after Easter and will be rescheduled after that time.
- The Sacrament of Penance should remain available according to need, but public Penance Services are not to be conducted.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick should also remain available for true emergencies. Hospitals and nursing homes may be on lock-down and priests are advised to check on their status beforehand.

#### **SCHOOLS, RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND OTHER CLOSURES**

- All Catholic schools in the Diocese will remain closed as mandated by the State of New Jersey. Directions for academic work have been provided by the Superintendent of Catholic Schools in coordination with Catholic school administrations.
- All religious education programs are suspended with at-home work provided by the local parish leaders where possible.

The Chancery offices will be closed March 16 through March 23 and staff will work remotely during that time. A limited number of staff will be present in the office on an as-needed basis to provide essential services.

- Pastors should make appropriate judgments regarding parish offices. Other regular parish activities and previously scheduled events should be postponed or canceled.

Catholic social and charitable outreach programs and services in the Diocese should be adjusted to meet directions mandated by the State of New Jersey.

The Catholic faithful of the Diocese — priests, religious and lay faithful — are advised to keep informed and updated regarding the progress of the coronavirus pandemic during this national and state emergency. FINALLY, avoid crowded areas, observe careful hygiene, keep appropriate distances outside the home and if feeling sick, stay at home. I ask that all of the faithful remember the elderly and other persons at risk in their families and communities, and reach out to them by phone to see if help is needed.

#### *A CALL TO PRAYER*

*An Act of Spiritual Communion is proposed for the faithful who are temporarily unable to receive the Eucharist:*

*"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.  
I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.*

*Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen."*

*Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform to the will of the Father and to do as we are told by Jesus, who has taken upon himself our sufferings and carried our sorrows to lead us, through the Cross, to the joy of the Resurrection.*

*Be present to all those suffering from coronavirus and to those who care for them: families, friends, neighbors, doctors, nurses, staff, government officials, pastors, priests and all who seek to do God's will. Bring comfort and calm to the elderly, to those at risk and to all who are afraid. Be for us all a beacon of hope, lighting our path once more to the heart of your beloved Son, the Divine Healer and Health of the Sick.*

*Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Deliver us from every danger,  
O glorious and blessed Virgin.*
