To All the Faithful of the Diocese of Trenton,

The Holy See has issued a decree regarding the celebrations of the upcoming Palm Sunday and Holy Week/Easter for implementation by Diocesan Bishops throughout the world. I have issued a decree for the Diocese of Trenton, implementing the directives of the Holy See (see pages 6, 7, and 8 of this bulletin).

These unprecedented measures have been deemed necessary, given the best information we have received from federal, state and local public health authorities.

Although COVID-19 has dramatically affected all of us in so many ways, I want to reach out to you with pastoral care and affection. Our public Holy Week and Easter celebrations will be quite different this year but the underlying mysteries of our faith in the Lord's passion, death and resurrection have not changed. They continue to be the source and support of our faith and we should celebrate them this year, even though in a different way.

Permit me please, as your Bishop, to encourage you to use all the means available, to sustain and nurture your faith. Follow Masses and other liturgical celebrations reverently on-line or via televised broadcast. Read the liturgical readings in your missals, other publications or on the internet. Pray your devotions privately or as families, especially the rosary, Stations of the Cross, and other beloved traditional devotions. Where it is possible and permitted, stop in church to visit and adore the Blessed Sacrament. If this is not possible, make a spiritual communion at home or wherever you may be. The great saints in our Church's history followed that practice. Keep your faith and prayer life alive until things in our public practice of the faith is restored.

Please stay as calm as possible. Faith and patience are good companions in the spiritual life. They become the source of charity in our genuine witness to the Lord Jesus and his Good News. Be kind and attentive to others — your own families, neighbors, friends and those who are elderly and alone. Reach out in the best ways possible. Be grateful to/for those who are working to address COVID-19 in so many different venues. Be generous. The pandemic is and will continue take its toll on families and on our parishes. Keep the needs of others in mind.

Above all, please remember that the Lord Jesus is in our midst, now and always. As he touched lives, healed the sick and ministered with love and merciful compassion throughout the Gospels, know that he will continue to do so for us. Have no doubt about that. "Be joyful in hope, persevere in hardship, keep praying regularly (Romans 12:12)."

God bless us all and protect us. O Mary, Mother of Divine Love, protect and lead us to the heart of your Son.

Dear Parish Family,

Thanks for your feedback on our first "Virtual Mass", it was nice hearing from you!!! As many of you noticed, this was a pre-recorded Mass. On Saturday March 22 myself, Fr. Jim and our Tech people worked most of the day to get Internet into the church. The equipment we need for live streaming will arrive this week so next weekend we it will be, *"Live from Jackson, it's Saturday night (& Sunday Morning!)"* Starting next Weekend the **Mass will be Live Streamed at 5pm on Saturday and at 10:30am on Sunday.** Have no anxiety at all about adhering to those times, while the Mass will be live at those times, when finished they will be archived and you can attend virtually anytime. For those who would like to go to Mass daily, we will **Live Stream Daily Mass every morning at 9am**, note the time change while we are under restrictions. This will be broadcast from our "Virtual Chapel". Daily, tomorrow Monday, we will also live stream Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with the Divine Mercy Novena.

Governor Phil Murphy has signed Executive Order #107 restricting movement in the State of New Jersey effective immediately. This prohibits, among a host of things, any public gathering of any kind. It impacts us as a Church since we cannot do Weddings, Baptisms, Masses or Funerals until further notice. Our engaged couples had already rescheduled their weddings because catering halls were canceling their receptions. Baptism the same. Funerals however do not depend on catering schedules. **No funerals can take place until the order is lifted**, (by Executive order #107) this will be painful for those who lose a loved one. Funeral Homes cannot have wakes or Services. Only burials or cremations are permitted. A priest may perform the Rites of Burial at the cemetery (if it is open) however we must wear gloves and mask, stay 6 feet from anyone and make no physical contact. Memorial Masses can be arranged after the restrictions are lifted.

The dying can be accompanied by phone, we will ask families to place us on speaker phone and we can all pray together using existing technologies to come together in prayer. These challenging times require, as Pope Francis urges us, creativity. Modern means allow us to be together without being physically present. Under current circumstances Anointing of the Sick can only be done in a hospital where proper precautions and specialized protection is available. In home is simply not safe. Even in the hospital it can only be given using a Q-tip. I know this will be upsetting to some of you but this virus know's no boundaries and respects no person, it takes orders from no one. Every COVID-19 carrier infects 3 other people, who in turn each infect 3 more people, do the math! We must work together to prevent it's spread and prevent our health care systems from being overwhelmed. Saturday March 22 at 4pm myself and Fr. Jim had our first **drive thru confessions**. While we were prepared, we had a small showing but it was a good test run. Once travel restrictions are lifted we will attempt this again. Please use the Bennetts-Mills Road Entrance, and follow the signs. We will be seated 6 feet away behind orange cones, roll down your window and stay in the vehicle. We will notify you when we are able to do this again. We are required to follow the legal restrictions in place and CDC guidelines for the health and safety of everyone. We are all responsible for each others health.

Fr. Jim and myself are quite healthy and have no pre-existing conditions so we will most likely just become ill, miserably ill, but we will recover. To continue bringing services to you we will stay healthy as long as we can. I have been saying all of the Private Masses and interacting with the public so that if I should fall ill, he can carry on and vice versa. in other words we have a plan in place and **we are not anxious at all!** Our prayer and hope for you is to be at peace. As Jesus reminds us countless times, "Do Not Fear" and "Fear is useless".

As Christians we are in the hands of God and under the nurturing care of the Mother of God!! We will all get through this together and with the Grace of God flourish as a parish once again. Until that time let us meet using the technology we are blessed with to stay close to the Lord and one another!

## DECREE - IN TIME OF COVID-19

As Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, I promulgate the following decree regarding the liturgies of Palm Sunday and Holy Week throughout the territorial Diocese of Trenton to assist the clergy and the faithful in the spiritual celebration of the Paschal Mysteries.

### **PALM SUNDAY**

No public gatherings (inside or outside Churches, in cars, etc.).

The Mass for Palm Sunday will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation, with palms blessed, and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Diocesan websites at 11 am on Sunday, April 5, 2020.

The Mass for Palm Sunday may be celebrated without a congregation by the pastor/parish priest in parish churches with live-stream capability; pastors should notify the parishioners of the time for the live-stream; pastors should also notify the Diocesan Office of Communications so that a Diocesan calendar/schedule of events might be posted for access by the faithful of the Diocese.

Blessed palms can be made available for distribution at a later date.

### **CHRISM MASS**

The Chrism Mass will be postponed and re-scheduled for another date/time with the renewal of priestly commitment and the blessing/consecration of oils occurring at that time.

Oils/chrism from the current supplies (currently in use) may continue to be used until a new supply is blessed/consecrated and made available.

**PASCHAL TRIDUUM:** the following liturgical directives are to be observed in accordance with the "Decree in Time of COVID-19" issued on March 19, 2020 by the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments by mandate of the Supreme Pontiff for the year 2020 only.

The Paschal Triduum **cannot** be transferred to another time.

### **HOLY THURSDAY**

No public gatherings (inside or outside Churches, in cars, etc.).

Televised or live-stream broadcasts should be live (not recorded).

The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Diocesan websites at 7 pm on Thursday, April 9, 2020.

The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper may be celebrated without a congregation by the pastor/parish priest in parish churches with live-stream capability; pastors should notify the parishioners of the time for the live-stream; pastors should also notify the Diocesan Office of Communications so that a Diocesan calendar/schedule of events might be posted for access by the faithful of the Diocese.

During the Evening Mass for the Lord's Supper:

- The Washing of the Feet, which is already optional, is to be omitted;
- The usual procession with the Blessed Sacrament to a place of repose is to be omitted and the Blessed Sacrament should be kept in the tabernacle, as usual.

Priests who are unable to celebrate Mass should instead pray Vespers of the day from the Liturgy of Hours instead.

### **GOOD FRIDAY**

No public gatherings (inside or outside Churches, in cars, etc.).

The Commemoration/Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Diocesan websites at 3 pm on Friday, April 10, 2020.

The Commemoration/Celebration of the Lord's Passion may be celebrated without a congregation by the pastor/parish priest in parish churches with live-stream capability; pastors should notify the parishioners of the time for the live-stream; pastors should also notify the Diocesan Office of Communications so that a Diocesan calendar/schedule of events might be posted for access by the faithful of the Diocese.

**HOLY SATURDAY**

No public gatherings (inside or outside Churches, in cars, etc.).

The Easter Vigil will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Diocesan websites at 7 pm on Saturday, April 11, 2020.

The Easter Vigil may be celebrated without a congregation by the pastor/parish priest in parish churches with live-stream capability; pastors should notify the parishioners of the time for the live-stream; pastors should also notify the Diocesan Office of Communications so that a Diocesan calendar/schedule of events might be posted for access by the faithful of the Diocese.

During the Easter Vigil:

- The preparation and lighting of the fire is omitted
- The paschal candle is lit without procession followed by the recited Easter Proclamation
- The Liturgy of the Word takes place
- The Baptismal Liturgy is only the renewal of Baptismal Promises; a symbolic (small) of Holy Water may be blessed but holy water fonts should remain empty
- The Rite of Christian Initiation and/or Reception into Full Communion will be postponed and re-scheduled once restrictions are lifted

Priests who are unable to celebrate the Easter Vigil should instead pray Vespers/Matins/Lauds of the day from the Liturgy of Hours instead.

**EASTER SUNDAY**

No public gatherings (inside or outside Churches, in cars, etc.).

Mass for Easter Sunday will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Diocesan websites at 10 am on Sunday, April 12, 2020.

Mass for Easter Sunday may be celebrated without a congregation by the pastor/parish priest in parish churches with live-stream capability; pastors should notify the parishioners of the time for the live-stream; pastors should also notify the Diocesan Office of Communications so that a Diocesan calendar/schedule of events might be posted for access by the faithful of the Diocese.

Priests are otherwise asked to celebrate Easter Sunday without a congregation.

Given by mandate of the Bishop, Most Reverend David M. O'Connell, C.M., J.C.D., March 20, 2020, for the Diocese of Trenton.

**POST-SCRIPT:**

No general absolution is to be given at this time; if that changes, it will be communicated / announced.

Regarding Plenary Indulgence:

The *Plenary Indulgence* is granted to the faithful suffering from Coronavirus, who are subject to quarantine by order of the health authority in hospitals or in their own homes if, with a spirit detached from any sin, they unite spiritually through the media to the celebration of Holy Mass, the recitation of the Holy Rosary, to the pious practice of the Way of the Cross or other forms of devotion, or if at least they will recite the Creed, the Lord's Prayer and a pious invocation to the Blessed Virgin Mary, offering this trial in a spirit of faith in God and charity towards their brothers and sisters, with the *will\** to fulfill the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the Holy Father's intentions), *as soon as possible*.

Health care workers, family members and all those who, following the example of the Good Samaritan, exposing themselves to the risk of contagion, care for the sick of Coronavirus according to the words of the divine Redeemer: "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (*Jn* 15: 13), will obtain the same gift of the *Plenary Indulgence* under the same conditions.

This Apostolic Penitentiary also willingly grants a *Plenary Indulgence* under the same conditions on the occasion of the current world epidemic, also to those faithful who offer a visit to the Blessed Sacrament, or Eucharistic adoration, or reading the Holy Scriptures for at least half an hour, or the recitation of the Holy Rosary, or the pious exercise of the Way of the Cross, or the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, to implore from Almighty God the end of the epidemic, relief for those who are afflicted and eternal salvation for those whom the Lord has called to Himself.

The Church prays for those who find themselves unable to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and of the *Viaticum*, entrusting each and every one to divine Mercy by virtue of the communion of saints and granting the faithful a *Plenary Indulgence* on the point of death, provided that they are duly disposed and have recited a few prayers during their lifetime (in this case the Church makes up for the three usual conditions required). For the attainment of this indulgence the use of the crucifix or the cross is recommended (cf. *Enchiridion indulgentiarum*, no.12).

(\*fulfillment of the usual conditions may not be immediately possible; therefore, the *will* to fulfill them suffices with the intention to fulfill the usual conditions “as soon as possible.”)

#### COVID-19

- Wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds, frequently!
- Avoid touching your face
- Avoid person to person contact (don't shake hands, don't fist bump, don't rub another's arms, don't hug etc.)
- Practice “Social Distancing” Keep from 3-6 feet away
- If sick stay home, call your physician, use Tele-Doc, **DO NOT** go into Doctors office, hospital, or Medi-Center, **call first**.
- If someone in your home is sick, self-contain yourself to prevent spread of the virus.
- If you are in a high-risk category; chronically ill, suppressed immunity, age etc. avoid large crowds and consider staying home.
- Mother Seton Academy is **closed** March 16-March 27 (may be extended).
- Aloysius Religious Education Program is **closed** from March 16-March 27 (may be extended).
- **Parish Offices will be closed** to visitors March 16-March 27 (may be extended) but will be available by phone or e-mail M-F 8:30am-4pm.
- All groups, meetings, seminars, society's, small community gatherings and all activities at the parish are **cancelled** until further notice.

His Excellency Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. Bishop of Trenton, grants a dispensation from the Obligation to attend Mass to all the Christian faithful of the Diocese of Trenton until further notice.


