Dear Parish Family,

The Catholic Faith speaks of two types of Works of Mercy; the Corporal (physical) Works of Mercy and the Spiritual (prayer/soul) Works of Mercy. Last Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday, there were two opportunities to participate in the Corporal Works of Mercy.

The first was the 'Blessing Bag Brigade' which was at all Masses. I reported in last week's bulletin the number of bags that came in early prior to Divine Mercy Sunday -172 plus a substantial amount of miscellaneous items. While I do not have a report on the total number collected prior and on Divine Mercy Sunday, I can venture a guess that the amount collected on Sunday exceeded the total previously dropped off plus a substantial number of miscellaneous items.

The Bags will go to homeless shelters in New Jersey and to other charities that assist the homeless. The miscellaneous items are collected and brought to group of individuals with Autism who sort the items into categories then pack complete blessing bags from the many surplus items. Nothing goes to waste.

The second Corporal Work of Mercy opportunity was after the 10:30am Mass. Various baby items were collected for use at Good Counsel Homes here in our Diocese. Good Counsel Homes provides housing for women and children in crisis pregnancy. A very worthy cause for our attention. The Blessing Bag Brigade was brought to our attention through a Deacon of our Diocese who works with this Middletown based charity. The Good Counsel Home initiative was sponsored by our Youth Group who also staffed the table on the Plaza Sunday.

Please take note that starting next Sunday there will be a 12 noon Traditional Mass on Sunday. This Mass will be *exclusively* traditional in format and offered in English by Fr. Jim Smith. This Mass will have Latin chants, Traditional Music, incense, exclusive use of the first Canon of the Mass (Eucharistic Prayer!), and Fr. Smith and the Congregation will together stand facing the Crucifix during the Canon of the Mass. As I forewarned several weeks ago, if you are adverse, allergic, or if any of these elements sends you into a apoplectic state (overcome by extreme anger or indignation) you should chose another one of the other 4 Masses offered by the parish rather than write me a letter- especially since I have now twice given you 'fair warning'. If you are overcome by heavenly grace and joy, by all means chose this Mass time. Enjoy – or not.

As Mass cards and donations to St. Mary's Seminary in Uganda continue to come in along with prayers and rosaries for my deceased father, John, I thank you once again for the outpouring of prayers and support. May he rest in Peace with all the souls of the faithful departed.

Congratulations to our Religious Education children and Mother Seton Academy children who received their First Holy Communion last weekend and this weekend.

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim
Focusing on God

In a previous post, I wrote of the importance of putting God at the center of our life. One of the phrases that often come up when discussing liturgy is *lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi*, “as we worship, so we believe, so we live.” This saying is central to who we are as practicing Catholics. How we worship says something about what we believe and how we live, and putting God at the center of our worship is integral. We do this primarily with our celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

On Sunday, May 8th at 12PM, we will begin a more traditional version of the *Novus Ordo* Mass. Those who attend will notice a few differences in how this Mass is celebrated. From the vestments to the music to the incense to the arrangement of the chairs to the direction the priest faces, it is all oriented and focused on God. When the *collect* or opening prayer is prayed, we all face the altar; when the *Our Father* is prayed, we all face the altar; when the Eucharistic Prayer is prayed, we all face the altar; when kneeling to receive Holy Communion, we all face the altar. The altar represents Christ—it is where the sacrifice of Calvary is re-presented; it is where Jesus becomes present to us.

On Sunday, May 8th at 12PM, we will begin a more traditional version of the *Novus Ordo* Mass. Join us as we focus more intently on God.

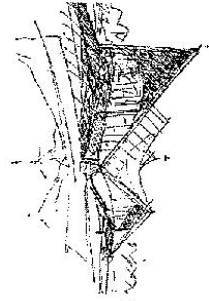

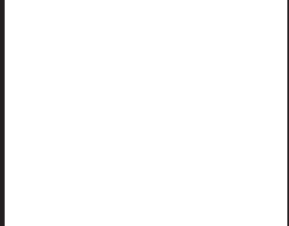
