Dear Parish Family-

On May 30th, Bishop David M. O'Connell issued a Decree for Phase II of the opening of our Parishes allowing Pastors, at their discretion, to open (or not to open) their Churches for Public Worship. If a Pastor chooses to open the Parish Church he must do so with restrictions contained in the Decree.



In his introductory remarks the Bishop emphasizes; "COVID 19 is still a virulent contagious virus communicated between people. Everyone should remain conscious and alert that risks to either contract or spread the disease remain possible at any gathering of people, indoors or outdoors. The risk is considered by public health experts to be especially significant indoors at prolonged, sedentary gatherings where coughing, sneezing and even talking/singing could easily communicate the coronavirus. "

As the Pastor I have made the decision to accept the options offered in the Decree and implement them on the dates suggested for implementation.

The obligation to attend Mass is suspended until September 7, 2020. Therefore there is no obligation to attend Mass in person. If you have concerns, worries or anxiety about returning, are sick, live with someone who is sick, have been exposed to Covid-19 or live with someone who has been exposed or is sick with Covid-19, are in a high risk category, have a compromised immune system or in any way do not feel well you are asked not to come in person but to make use of the Live Streaming of Masses which will continue.

On Monday, June 8, weekday Mass will once again be open to the faithful who wish to attend. Mass will remain at 9:00am and will be live streamed for those who cannot attend. The maximum allowed number of attendees in the Church is set at 25 persons by the Bishop. We will observe this restriction. Those who attend are required to wear a mask for the Mass, observe 6 feet of social distance at all times from all other participants. The other restrictions in place for Sunday Mass found below also apply to daily Mass, with the exception of the maximum allowed for Sunday. Daily Mass limit is set at 25.

The Public Celebration of the Sunday Celebration may commence on Saturday, June 13 at our regular weekend schedule (Saturday at 5:00pm, Sunday at 7:00am, 8:30am 10:30am and 12:30pm) with restrictions including:

1. A maximum allowed attendance at 1/3rd of the capacity of the building. For St. Aloysius that would be a maximum of 400 persons.
2. Those choosing to attend must wear masks
3. Observe 6 feet of social distance.
4. Bring your own hand sanitizer with you and use it before entering the building, before Communion and after Communion.
5. There will only be ONE entrance into the Building and ONE exit through the CENTER MAIN FRONT DOORS.
6. Communion will be distributed at the END of Mass, once you receive Holy Communion depart the building without socializing or gathering with others.
7. Mass attendees may only sit in pews marked with Green Tape. You may not sit in pews marked in Red. Every third pew is available for seating. You must sit, unless you live in the same household, 6 feet apart in a pew.
8. There will be no collection taken up during Mass. You may place your contributions in a Basket by the Baptismal Font, as we do for Holy Days, before or after Mass.
9. There will be no singing.
10. No greeters.
11. No holy water.
12. No candles available.
13. No missals, hymnals or prayer cards.
14. No paper of any kind allowed to be brought into the building.
15. No offertory presentation of the gifts.
16. No sign of peace.
17. No contact between those attending.
18. *Strictly prohibited is the touching, kissing or other forms of contact with statues or other sacred objects.

19. No gathering of individuals inside or outside the Church.
20. There will be no Children's Liturgy of the Word.
21. No in person RCIA (they will continue to use Jitsi).
22. When Mass is over an orderly dismissal is required and no gatherings of people inside or outside anywhere on our property.
23. Priest may not greet parishioners before or after Mass.
24. Priests will not wear masks during Mass but must wear Masks to distribute Communion and sanitize their hands according to the directives.
25. Priests homilies are to be short.
26. Only the Body of Christ may be distributed, no common cup.
27. There will be no Altar Servers.
28. The Priest and or Deacon will fulfill all liturgical roles, including proclamation of the Word; no one may enter the Sanctuary.
29. Live Streaming of Public Mass will continue.

Those who sincerely wish to come and praise God will be able to, provided they abide by the restrictions in place for the safety and health of all who attend. The Church is legally private Property. Those coming are obligated to observe these restrictions for the health and safety of all who make the choice to come in person to Masses or Ceremonies. Those who cannot observe, flagrantly disregard or cannot abide by the restrictions should remain at home. Violators will be invited to depart the property and if they refuse the authorities will be called.

Confession: Use of Confessionals or Reconciliation Rooms are not permitted at this time. Confession, where serious sin is present, can be arranged with a priest but must take place outdoors with masks and 6 feet of distance with a physical barrier between the priest and penitent. There is no obligation to confess venial sin at this time. Regarding the Easter Duty the Bishop states the following: "The fulfillment of the Easter Duty may be accomplished before the First Sunday of Advent, November 29, 2020. The teachings of the Church regarding 'Easter Duty', as reflected in both the Catechism and the Code of Canon Law, indicate that there is an obligation to receive these Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist --- preceded by sacramental confession, if conscious of grave sin ---at least once a year, usually during the Easter season, unless there is a "just reason" that requires its fulfillment at another time of the year. In the Diocese of Trenton, it has been impossible to fulfill these obligations until the sacraments are readily available again. In short, the presence of the COVID-19 situation is a "just reason" to delay the fulfillment of this duty and thus the obligation is moved to a time in the future when these sacraments are available again."

Baptism may be done in private with only one baby and a number of restrictions including no more than 25 total present and no physical contact between the Priest and the participants. Masks and 6 feet of distance are mandatory between all present must be maintained. The anointing with the Oil of Catechumen and the Ephpheta prayer are suspended at this time. Baptism must be administered using a Baptismal Shell; the anointing with Chrism is done with a Q-tip. No group photos before, during or after the ceremony. When the ceremony is finished all must depart the building and property.

Marriages Ceremonies are permitted but not nuptial Masses. The Ceremony may only have a total of 25 people, masks are mandatory (except Bride and Groom), no group photos before, during or after the ceremony. Only those pews marked with green tape may be used, no group photos before, during or after the ceremony among other restrictions. All participants must depart the building and property immediately after the Ceremony ends.

Funerals may commence in Church the Week of June 8 with no more than 25 people which includes the priest, music minister or other liturgical ministers. The placing and use of the Pall is suspended. Masks and 6 feet of social distance are mandatory and only those pews with Green tape may be used. The Priest will fulfill all liturgical roles including proclamation of the Word; no one may enter the Sanctuary. All must depart at the end of the Mass and may not gather together.

These are all provisional as we move through Phase II of the reopening and allow us to once again celebrate our Spiritual Life within reasonable health and safety precautions! Welcome Back! It will be good to see you.

This weekend, June 6/7, following the 10:30am Mass, Holy Communion will be offered outside of the Church as it was last weekend. This practice will cease after June 7.
