Dear Parish Family-



Greetings to all grand, great-grand and great-great-grand parents as we celebrate this third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly! Three years ago, Pope Francis instituted this annual celebration; he has made no secret of his devotion to his own grandmother, Rosa, whom he tells us taught him so much and with whom he enjoyed a rich relationship.

At funerals for the elderly, I often note that I am unsure who has the greater place of privilege-- the grandparent or the grandchild. Like Pope Francis, I am not a grandparent so I cannot say if being a grandparent is better but, as a grandchild who was very close to his grandparents and even my great-grandmother, I believe being a grandchild is the place of greater privilege. I was very conscience of this even as a child as so many of my contemporaries did not have grandparents or lived very far from them. I always had a sense that I was blessed to know all four of my grandparents and to even know my great-grandmother.

Growing up, my grandparents' homes were my second home and 1 spent many happy days with them. For much of my growing up, my grandmother and great-grandmother lived in the same house with us. My great-grandmother would allow me to drink coffee; always half-coffee and half cream with 3 sugars! As an adult 1 drank my coffee this way for many years to the great horror of my peers! My grandparents always had the things we loved available when we visited, they showered us with affection and love; they offered us wisdom and comfort.

Pope Francis says to us on this third year of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, *"Their presence in families and communities is a precious one, for it reminds us that we share the same heritage and are part of a people committed to preserving its roots. From the elderly we received the gift of belonging to God's holy people. The Church, as well as society, needs them, for they entrust to the present the past that is needed to build the future. Let us honour them, neither depriving ourselves of their company nor depriving them of ours."* 

A most beautiful message for this special day for those special people in our lives. To this day I am comforted and brought joy thinking with great affection of my grandparents and my great-grandmother. All of them people of faith who modeled the love of God for us from whom we received the witness of the Christian faith.

The Pope places special emphasis on these relationships on this day, the Sunday closest to the Feast of St. Joachim and Anne (this year Wednesday July 26), the Grandparents of Jesus. We probably do not think about it too often but our savior had grandparents who helped to raise him.




