Dear Parish Family,

Thank you to all those able to contribute to the Holy Land Collection last weekend, normally this would be taken up on Good Friday but we were in lockdown so the US Bishop's moved it to the Sunday closest to the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. This collection is important to supporting the various shrines in the Holy Land marking important places and moments in the Life of Jesus and his Holy Mother. The Custodians of these places are the Franciscans of the Custody, they are formed from volunteer Franciscan Friars from around the world who serve in the Holy Land for period of time to keep up the holy places and assist pilgrims.

I share with you a link sent to me by Loyola Press, a Jesuit Publishing house, it is a link to a talk given by Julianna Stanz who works for the Diocese of Green Bay and is a consultant to the USCCB. She is an Irish American so she speaks with a lovely lilt. The presentation is on Hope and it is only her voice and some slides. You could listen to the whole presentation in one sitting or use the individual chapters for a quick 1-2 minute prayer reflection. The entire presentation is only 30minutes. This is not a dense theological type presentation, it is a nice easy to understand presentation with some suggestions for action. You do have to give your name and an e-mail address to register. During the four Tuesdays of the Month of October I will be offering reflections on Catholic Mysticism at 3pm. The dates are: Oct. 6, 13, 20 & 27. These reflections will be offered in the Church live you are welcome to come in person (wear your mask!) or you can join via Live Stream. The presentations will also be archived on our You Tube Channel if you are not available on those days and times. I will offer 30-45 minutes of reflection and 15 minutes for questions. The first week I will reflect on Mysticism in general and Catholic Mysticism in particular. The next three weeks I will reflect on the Rhineland, Flemish, English, Spanish and French Victorian mystics. You don't need to have any knowledge of the mystics to attend. These are spiritual reflections. While Mysticism may not be a topic you are familiar with you certainly have heard of some mystics such as the lay woman St. Catherine of Siena, St. Theresa of Avila, St. Augustine of Hippo to mention a few. Not all mystics are saints; one of the giants is Meister Eckhart who is not a saint. Some are Doctors of the Church such a St. John of the Cross and St. Hildegard of Bingen. They are an interesting lot and their lives help to place 'mile markers' and stepping stones on the journey to God for us.

Effective August 1 the Obligation to attend Mass is suspended Until Further Notice. You are not obligated to attend Mass at this time due to Pandemic. Bishop O'Connell encourages Catholics to attend an in-person Mass or participate in Mass via Live Stream until the dispensation ceases in order to "Keep Holy, the Lord's Day". Please note each week 2 Masses are archived for viewing later in the day.

Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. ***Those in high risk categories and those with pre-existing conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream.***

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ **Mask must cover both the nose and the mouth**
- ✓ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before you arrive.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed after Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ Communion can be taken on the tongue or the hand, the risk is identical.

What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: “Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one’s] heart more specifically: do this, shun that” (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn’t just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1) Begin by **being open to the truth** and what is right.
- 2) **Study Sacred Scripture** and the **teaching** of the Church.
- 3) **Examine the facts** and **background information** about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4) **Prayerfully reflect** to discern the will of God (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- 1) Seek the **prudent advice** and **good example** of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- 3) Pray for the **gifts of the Holy Spirit** to help us develop our conscience.
- 4) Regularly partake in an **examination of conscience** to hear God’s voice in your life.¹

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. “Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere “feeling” about what we should or should not do. Rather, **conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart**, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil.”²

Here are some questions for further reflection:

1. When has my conscience guided me to “do good and avoid evil”?
2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
3. Forming conscience is a “lifelong task.” What do I do to *regularly* form my conscience? What more should I do?
