Dear Parish Family,

Last weekend we used the new Worship Aide, aka Hymnal or Missalette. These are purchased about every 10 years give or take and avoid throwing away large quantities of paper Missalette's every year. They are more environmentally sound in accord with the teaching of Pope Francis on the care of our common home.

Environmental issues seem to be the cause de jour and a common ground in an increasingly uncommon ground world we live in and for good reason. As our Holy Father reminds us we drink from our own wells and if those wells are poisoned by pollution we will die. So working together to promote environmentally sound initiatives to save the planet is also saving our selves. When God created the world he gave to men and women stewardship of the planet. As Chief Seattle once said, "We belong to the earth; the earth does not belong to us". We are the caretakers of creation, with reverence and care we ought to be good custodians leaving the earth better than the way we found it.

While Governments hold big meetings like the COP26 Summit in Scotland, ordinary citizens can advance the protection of the environment where they live in simple ways. The simplest way is to avoid throwing trash out our windows while driving, making sure our trash cans are secure, not wasting water, recycling, composting and such. Each of us can impact the health of the planet in simple ways. We can install butterfly gardens, bat houses, birdhouses, tubes for bees, bird baths, salt licks etc.

This time of the year reminds us of the dangers nature faces, dangers we are responsible for in nature. Just looking around our own township we see deer dead on the side of the roads and other animals as well. When I pass areas that were once vast swaths of forest that have been clear cut for development one begins to wonder how many creatures great and small lost their habitat and are forced to move in search of habitable space, food and water. While we could argue about the deer population consider how development impacts other species we share the planet with on a daily basis. Where do they go when their habitat is destroyed? When they move to new habitats and that is destroyed, the space they can occupy begins to contract and shrink exponentially. We live in an eco-system where all life supports and depends on other life. Something to ponder and consider is our part and our responsibility for the health of the planet and species entrusted to our stewardship by God. Something to add to our prayer and contemplation time, how can I make a positive difference in my own stewardship of the earth?

This weekend begins the bi-annual 'Called by Name' program of the Diocese of Trenton which seeks to indentify men whom God may be calling to service in the Priesthood. We ask you to pray and reflect on who you believe would be a good priest. In the early Church the laity 'called' men to the priesthood by 'name' inviting them to consider serving the community, this weekend we invite you to begin a process of discernment of men you believe should be 'called by name' to consider a vocation to the priesthood. Due to the pandemic this program was delayed an extra year but three years ago it was effective and men entered the seminary because someone in their parish identified them as a potential vocation. In some instances the men had not seriously thought about it until they were contacted by the Vocation Director because someone like you submitted their name.
