### Dear Parish Family-

As we begin the Christmas Season (ending on the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, Jan. 10) I want you to be aware of the good that has been unfolding even amid pandemic; the parish, with the assistance of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, distributed gifts to 134 families through the Adopt-A-Family Christmas Ministry. Additionally our parish men, of the Knights of Columbus (the organization some US Senators consider a terrorist organization) assisted an additional 154 families this Christmas. One family was about to lose their home were assisted by your generous donations are now safe and sound in their home for the foreseeable future (more than \$14,000 was raised in an incredibly short time frame). The total number of local families assisted was 289, not even a pandemic could halt the good cheer! THANK YOU on behalf of all those assisted and to our ministry volunteers who spent countless hours to make the magic happen!

As a pastor I receive many Christmas Cards both paper and virtual. I have all displayed in my office on the Altar we used during the lock down earlier in the year around the Relic of St. Aloysius. I have entrusted all of you to his prayers and care.

My favorite Christmas Card this year came as an e-card from Pro Terra Sancta. This is a charity whose offices are in Milan, Italy but who work in the Holy Land, their name "Pro Terra Sancta" means 'For the Holy Land'. The card is in the form of a video with a small group of Pro Terra Sancta Co-workers making a pilgrimage through the streets of Bethlehem to the Church of the Nativity. As I watched it I could not fail to notice how few people were in Bethlehem due to the pandemic. The Church of the Nativity is one of the holiest sites in the Christian world and one usually shoulder to shoulder with pilgrims waiting long hours in line to venerate the star, the place where Jesus was born, in the cave under the Church yet the video is devoid of any people but the little pilgrim group of Pro Terra Sancta Co-workers. If you have a chance I invite you to view it, it is a very uplifting and beautifully executed video card showing the City of Bethlehem, it's people, the crafts, local business that support pilgrims and great interior shots of the Church of the Nativity and the Cave below it. The entrance to the Church is called 'the door of humility' because pilgrims must stoop down to enter, just as Jesus stooped down to become one of us. Check it out — <a href="https://youtu.be/645LihjWMyE">https://youtu.be/645LihjWMyE</a> There will be a warning in Italian that asks you to accept cookies (Hey its holiday); 'accetto' means accept and 'rifiuto' means decline, click either one and the video card will play. I recommend you go to full screen to see the vivid imagery.

There was a special show on Fox News hosted by Peter Hegseth on Christmas night titled the "Battle for Bethlehem" (a rather unfortunate title). Whatever you may think of Fox News, it was a pretty fair assessment of the sad state of affairs in Bethlehem and the extreme minority of Christians left there, somewhere between 1%-10%, and difficulties our fellow Christians face living there. I believe it is available online and worth attention to get a picture of what our fellow Christians face while they maintain the Holy Site of the Nativity of the Lord.

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ Mask must cover both the nose and the mouth
- √ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before leaving your home.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed <u>after</u> Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ It is requested you take Communion in the hand but can be taken on the tongue.

The State currently permits 25% if capacity which is 286 people per Mass in our building. The highest # of people at Mass has been at 10:30am and we have reached 23% of capacity. - Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and other Celebrations limited to 50 people this number includes family, clergy, outside attendants, anyone breathing and all the restrictions found above for weekend Masses.
