Dear Parish Family,

Every year between the months of May and August, the Diocese of Trenton participates in the Missionary Cooperative Plan (MCP). The MCP is a way for Christians in the first world to assist our brothers and sisters in need in impoverished lands. Each parish in the Diocese is assigned a Missionary through the Office for the Propagation of the Faith. Our Mission Director for the Diocese is Fr. PJ Alindogan, who is also pastor of our neighboring parish St. Veronica in Howell. Fr. PJ visited Barishal in the spring, and shared with me the terrible poverty there, worse than he imagined and, he has seen a lot of poverty as our Mission Director!

This year our Parish welcomes, as our guest for the Missionary Cooperative Plan, The Most Reverend Emmanuel Kanon Rozario. His Excellency is the second Bishop of the Diocese of Barishal in the South Asian Country of Bangladesh. He was consecrated a Bishop and installed as Ordinary of Barishal in 2022.

The Country he hails from is Bangladesh in Southeast Asia, bordered by India and Myanmar. Bangladesh is a mostly Sunni Muslim country, but freedom of religion is enshrined in law. It has a population of 170 million people, in an area of 57,320 square miles, making it the 8th most densely populated country on earth. Approximately 20% of the population lives below the poverty level. For most of Bangladesh's history, it was under Indian or Pakistani rule. The country was previously known as Bengal or East Pakistan. It gained independence in 1971, and was then considered the 2nd poorest country in the world at its founding. It has struggled greatly, but has also made major strides to overcome this level of poverty, and is on track to lower middle class status by 2026. However, there continues to remain pockets of intense poverty, such as in the Diocese of Barishal.

The Diocese of Barishal is a relatively new Diocese, having been erected by Pope Francis in 2015. It comprises 11 districts spread over 7,995 square miles of territory. The Diocese has a general population of over 15 million people, with only 19, 567 Catholics, making up approximately 2% of the population. The Diocese of Barishal has only 9 parishes and outstations, served by 12 Diocesan Priests, assisted by 4 Religious Order Priests. It also has a seminary to prepare men for the priesthood with 4 Religious Brothers, and a small number of Religious Sisters who assist in various ministries.

When I was a child, my grandmother lived outside of Orlando in Florida, and when we visited, we would also go to Disney. Our favorite amusement there was "It's a Small World", with the accompanying song. Our world is indeed very small and I have found this to be true throughout my life. How small? Well, ten years ago, while leading a pilgrimage to Fatima, Portugal, I met a young priest named Fr. David Ghorami, now chancellor of the Diocese of Barishal, who was working as a Chaplain at the Shrine during his break from studies in Rome; he was from Bangladesh. When I asked where he was from, he said it was a small country in Southeast Asia that I most assuredly had never heard of; then said, Bangladesh. To his surprise, and mine, I had heard of Bangladesh! In my first priestly assignment, a son of the parish, who was an elderly Missionary Priest, would come each summer to visit his family from Bangladesh. This missionary priest shared with me the terrible poverty of the country, and also the joy he had in mission there, telling me that when he died he wished to be buried among his people. He is buried in Bangladesh. This priest was Fr. David Ghorami's seminary professor!

It is a small world after all; it's a small, small world! Please be as generous as you can to Bishop Emmanuel Rosario and through him our brothers and sisters in need in Barishal, Bangladesh.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.








Pilgrims of Hope: Pope Francis Declares 2025 a Year of Jubilee
